

Scores Moscow's Attitude Toward Catholic Church

ROME (By WIRELESS-RNS) — Moscow's attitude toward the Catholic Church was described as an obstacle to spiritual unity among the people of Europe by *Il Tempo*, independent newspaper published here.

The intransigence against the Catholic Church by the Kremlin, which has affected a reconciliation with the Russian Orthodox Church during this war, brings an unexpected element into the post-war atmosphere, *Il Tempo* said.

"This lack of spiritual comprehension is an obstacle to the drawing together of peoples, and we firmly believe that the spirit of victorious Russia is otherwise extanted."
