## Fear Yalta Decision Effects in Yugoslavia

WASHINGTON (NC) — Catholic Slovenes who have found their new homeland in this country have expressed to the U. S. Department of State their anxiety over the implications of the decisions reached by the "Big Three" at Yalta regarding Yugoslavia.

A memorandum, submitted by the Union of Slovenian Parishes of America, calls attention to certain articles in the agreement between Marshall Tito of Yugoslavia and Dr. Ivan Subotic which, though sanctioned by the Crimean Conference, "may cause harm and not those opposed to the Tito regime of their right to vote."

In a supplementary announcement the signers of the memorandum declare that, according to last reports, eight more priests have been killed by Partisans in Slovenia, raising the total to 48. Similar conditions prevail in Croatia and Dalmatia, where, it is asserted, 18 Franciscan priests of the Province of the Holy Rosary, have been slain.

"The new administration in Yugoslavia, etc." the State Department is told, "with laws which will become such only with Tito's consent or through judges dependent on him, interpret the word 'collaboration' as it pleased, and exclude from the right of voting anyone who does not agree with the Partisan movement, or who does not support the communists as the leaders of Yugoslavia. Such an administration will certainly not make for internal peace; nor can peace be expected with communistic Yugoslavia."

LONDON (C) — By WIRELESS (NC) — Russian occupation authorities in Hungary have made no attempt to interfere with religious affairs, according to Count Michael Károlyi, head of the Hungarian Council in Great Britain, composed of representatives of various anti-Fascist groups.

Other spokesman for the Council here disclosed that the provisional government includes Julian Nagy, out-

standing Protestant layman, and that nearly all the Party members inter-party committees taking over local government in the wake of advancing Russian troops include one or more clergymen. The fact, however, that a large proportion of these clergymen are Protestant is regarded as some question as evidence that Russian authorities are somewhat less favorably disposed toward Roman Catholics.
