

SOLEMN HOLY WEEK RITES LISTED IN DIOCESE

Bishop Kearney Officiates At Cathedral Services

Solemn Holy Week services throughout the diocese and centering in Sacred Heart Cathedral will prepare the faithful for the joys and hopes of Easter. Holy Week begins with liturgy of Palm Sunday to be carried out in the churches of the diocese this Sunday.

His Excellency, the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester will officiate at the Solemn Pontifical Holy Week Mass in Sacred Heart Cathedral on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, Holy Thursday.

The Bishop will officiate at Solemn Pontifical Mass and the Blessing of the Holy Oils at 10:30 a.m. Holy Thursday in the Cathedral. His Excellency will preside at the Terminal Service in the Cathedral beginning at 6 p.m. on Holy Thursday. The Rt. Rev. Mgr. J. F. Gough will be master of ceremonies. Students of St. Bernard's Seminary will assist under the direction of the Rev. Benedict Shahan.

A May Hour will be conducted in Sacred Heart Cathedral by priests of the Cathedral from 8 to 9 p.m. on Holy Thursday and all night vigil before the Resurrection will take place with watchers from the different parish parishes.

At St. Patrick's Church, Plymouth Ave. North and Brown St., a Holy Hour beginning at 10 p.m. will be conducted by Bishop Kearney for members of the Nocturnal Adoration Society.

Good Friday Bishop Kearney will celebrate the Mass of the Prodiges in Sacred Heart Cathedral on Good Friday beginning at noon. The Three Hour service will continue until 3 p.m. with the Bishop officiating.

Services on Holy Saturday will begin in the Cathedral at 7 a.m. with the Rt. Rev. Mgr. George V. Burns, pastor, officiating. Services will consist of Blessing of the New Fire, of the Paschal Candle and of the Baptismal and Easter Water and Mass of Holy Saturday.

4 Catholic G.I.s Die, 6 Wounded in Battle

Four died in war action, two are missing, six wounded and one, formerly reported missing, is now a prisoner, reports this week indicate.

First Lieut. Michael A. Manning, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. Mitchell J. Manning, 807 Knickerbocker Ave., was killed in action Feb. 27 over China, his parents have learned.



Veteran of more than 25 Pacific battles Manning was a member of a Liberator, Lieutenant Manning had been returned to this country only to volunteer for more duty overseas. He had been in the China-Burma theater as navigator of a B-29 Superfortress for little more than a month at the time he was killed.

A former Aquinas student, Lieutenant Manning went into service in June, 1941 and overseas first in September, 1942. He had been awarded the Presidential Citation, the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal.

Besides his parents he leaves three sisters, Margaret, Rita and Mary Manning at home. Requiem Mass will be offered Saturday in Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral at 9 a. m.

Pvt. James I. Schneider of East Rochester, 19, was killed in action Feb. 20, a day after his twin brother.

Pvt. Thomas L. Schneider was wounded in the same locality in Germany.

Both sons of Mr. and Mrs. Robert J. Schneider, 64 W. Elm St., the twins went into service together and were sent overseas in January.

Another brother, Pfc. Robert J. Schneider is in the European theater and two sisters Rita and Lucille Schneider are living at home.

Pfc. George J. Marcell Jr., 28, is hospitalized in England of wounds suffered Jan. 26 in Belgium, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. George J. Marcell, 604 Windsor

Rd. are informed. A member of Holy Cross parish, he enlisted Mar. 15, 1942 and has been overseas since June 1944. Serving with Seabees in the Philippines is a brother, Mr. Maxine Marcell.

Staff Sgt. Louis E. Justice of Lyons, 28, was killed in action on Iwo Jima Jan. 28, according to word received by his mother, Mrs. Peter Murray 18 Madison St. The soldier had not been home for nearly 3 1/2 years.

Sergeant Justice enlisted in the Infantry in Oct., 1940 following training on the west coast. He went to and saw action in many major Pacific victories.

Besides his mother and stepfather, he leaves six sisters, Mrs. Joseph Patrone, Rochester; Mrs. Benedict Cobo, Newark; Mrs. Carl Gelhaus, Savannah, Ga.; Mrs. George Sullivan and Miss Virginia Marra of Lyons, and one brother, John Justice of Lyons.

Second Lieut. John D. Agan, 21, son of Mrs. Marie F. Agan, 624 Geneva St., was killed in action piloting a P-41 night fighter over Mindoro, the War Department has informed his mother.

A former pupil of St. Monica's School, Lieutenant Agan entered service in May, 1942 and went overseas last November after training in California and Arizona.

Surviving besides his mother are a sister, Mrs. Charles Noto, a brother, Daniel E. Agan, and two nephews all of Rochester.
