

2 Auburn GIs Give Lives in Europe

Auburn—Two soldiers from Auburn parishes have made the supreme sacrifice in action in the European theater, war casualty reports reveal this week. Mr. and Mrs. Walter Flanigan of Queen Court Apartments, South Street, were notified by the War Department that their son, Pfc. Paul Flanigan, 24, of the Army had been killed in action in Germany on February 23. Pfc. Flanigan was wounded in action on two previous occasions. Following the second injury, he was confined to an army hospital from October to about Christmas time last year. His first wound was not serious but the second injury received in France was very serious and resulted in the removal of part of his stomach. He was with the First Army when killed in action.

Pfc. Flanigan was a graduate of St. Alphonsus School and later attended Monroe High School in Rochester. He left Monroe High when he reached his 18th birthday to enlist in the army. He was stationed in the Panama Canal Zone and later was at Trinidad. He was home at Easter time two years ago and shortly after his furlough he went overseas.

Pvt. Herman J. Kleintjes, 36, of the Army, son of Stephen Kleintjes, Hayes Avenue, section of St. Alphonsus Church, was killed in action in Belgium on March 2. Kleintjes enlisted in the army and served one enlistment when he was given an honorable discharge from

the service in July, 1940. For 4 years during that interval he was stationed in the Hawaiian Islands and later at the Army's reception center where it was located at Fort Niagara. He was called up for service last April and received his training at Fort Benning, Ga. He was home on furlough last Christmas time and left for overseas July 6, Jan. 4, 1945.

Pius X Remains Moved To New Vatican Niche

Vatican City—(INC)—The body of Pope Pius X has been translated from the crypt of St. Peter's Basilica to a specially prepared niche in the Basilea's Presentation Chapel, also commonly known as the Chapel of St. Ann.

The translation took place in a private ceremony attended by His Eminence Cardinal Cicali, Grand Prelate of the Holy Roman Catholic Church and a small group of other dignitaries.

The remains of the Pope Pius X had become inaccessible in the crypt of St. Peter's because of extensive remodeling work now in progress there. They will rest in the crypt in a new niche facing the monument of Pope Benedict XV.
