A period of 10 minutes grace will be allowed, postponements will be allowed in case of rain or wet grounds. Postponed games will be ordered replayed on a date selected by the Commissioner. All games will be seven innings, 4½ innings constitutes a game.

Two rounds will be played followed by a three game playoff to determine the championship winner. At the conclusion of the season all league players will be the guests at a banquet in Columbus Center and the K. of C. trophy will be awarded to the winner on this occasion.

800-Year-Old Abbey In American Hands

Olcene — (INC) — The Stars and Stripes now wave over the famed Benedictine Abbey of Maria Laach, whose 800-year-old Abbey church, a masterpiece of Romanesque architecture, has escaped destruction.

Abbot Idefons Horwegen and his whole community are well and the magnificent liturgical services continue, although the community is now considerably smaller than before the war.

The smaller bells of the Abbey church were confiscated by the Nazis, but three larger bells still remain in the towers. The Abbey buildings were used as a German army hospital.

Outgoing French Envoy Received by Holy Father

Vatican City — (INC) — His Holiness Pope Pius XII received a private audience on Wednesday Hubert Guérin, Provincial Minister of France to the Holy See, prior to his return home.
