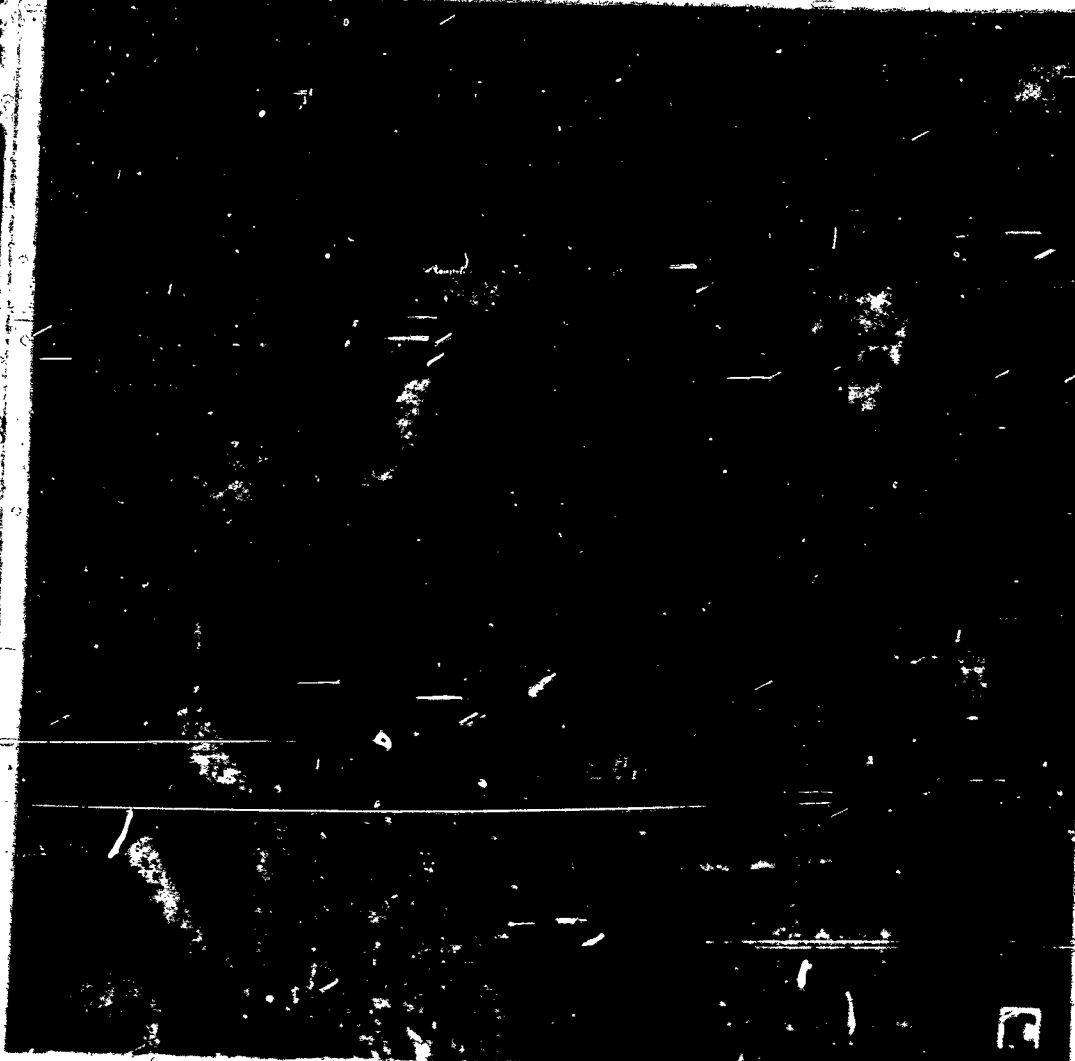


Yalta Protest Made

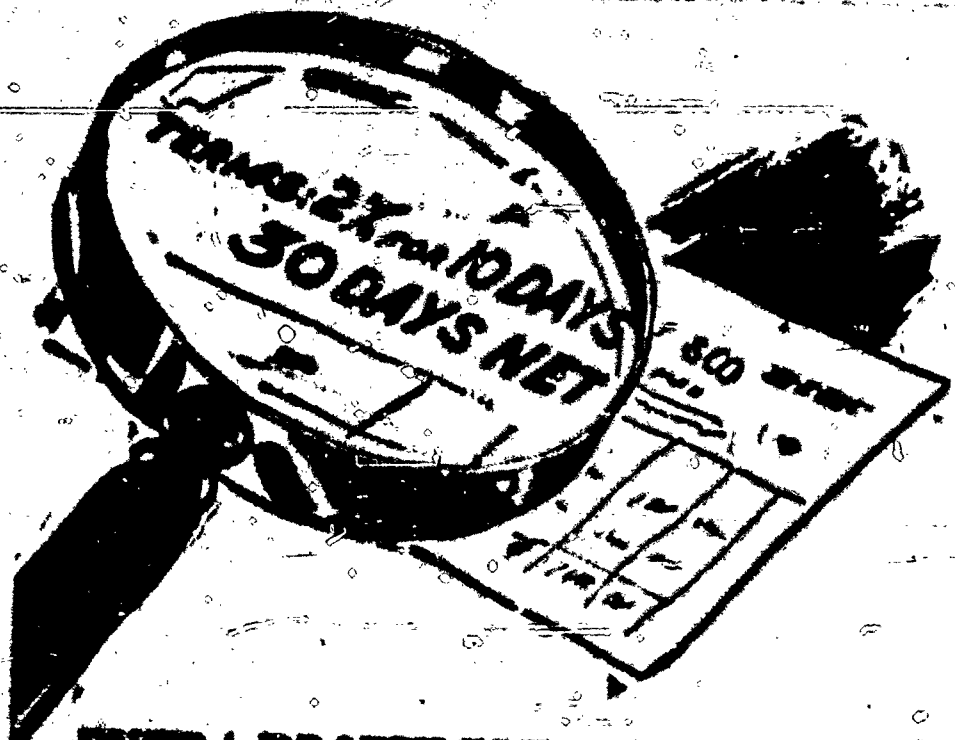

NCCS Serving 'All Who Serve' Opens 5th Year

Washington, D. C. — On April 21, the National Catholic Community Service, member agency of USO, will observe its Fourth Anniversary.

Though it offers social, educational, and recreational programs, NCCS is primarily concerned with the spiritual welfare of those in the war effort. Working in cooperation with Army and Navy chaplains, NCCS has distributed, during the past 16 months alone, to men and women in the Armed Forces, more than 20,000,000 religious articles, including rosaries, medals, crucifixes, and medals. Communion breakfasts, Novenas and Holy Masses are but a few of the religious activities sponsored by more than 800 NCCS-operated USO Clubs from coast to coast, whose motto, "NCCS Serves All Who Serve," became a welcome to those in uniform and non-production workers, regardless of race or creed.

Though new in name, NCCS is actually carrying on the tradition of service administered during World War I by the National Catholic War Council, and continued during peace time by the National Catholic Welfare Conference. The \$200,000 grants the visit NCCS clubs every month, are finding in them, a help with their families and home parishes. Club coordinators, assigned to each club, have helped many men and women, who had abandoned their faith, to return to the sacraments.
