The card received by Private Natal's parents was written Jan. 20 from a German prison camp. This was the first information received by his parents since he was listed as missing on Dec. 16. The Ithacan asked his parents not to worry because everything was "O.K." and wrote that he was in the best of health. Private Natal entered the Army April 2, 1945 and went overseas in October. A graduate of Immaculate Conception School in 1939, Natal was graduated from Bishop High School in 1941.
