"Because Soviet troops played a leading past in driving there mana out of Poland Stalin should have the right to annex as much Polish territory as he may desire," - "By this process of reasoning," arguer Chamberlin, "America and Great Britale would be entitled to annex large parts of France and Italy. The war is a co-operative enterprise. If Russian troops with some asnistance from Polish nationalist forces, drove the Germana out of Poland, American, British and Canadian lend-lease supplies, and the general war effort of all the United Nations, certainly helped to drive the Germans out of Russia.

Where is the voice of Amer hean public opinion with its vaunted reputation for fair play? Mr. Chamberlin states that Poland is the victim of silence and misrepresentation. To this we can add the fear that Poland is also the victim, at least in this country, of those who don't care. Do we really believe in democracy? Do we really believe in liberty? Do we really believe in justice? Then why be slient and indifferent about Poland? From can we reconcile love of our Polish ally with indifference to her plight? Is not our silence a case of betraying Poland with a kies? From us Poland might prefer the more honorable attack of the sword. "We all kill the thing we love. The brave man with a sword.
