Tech. Sgt. Gr. Robert Rhyne, 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Rhyne, 7 Donlon St., suffered slight injuries in action Feb. 25 in Germany. His parents have been informed. A former pupil of Blessed Sacrament School, he was a member of the old 20th of the National Guard. He has been overseas with the infantry since January.

Pvt. John Mancino, 26, parishioner of St. Bridget's Church, was seriously wounded in action on Iwo Jima Feb. 26, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Angelo Mancino, 40 Emmett St., have learned. In service since Feb. 27, 1942, he went overseas two years ago in January. Also in service are two brothers, Cpl. Anthony Mancino, recently freed in Germany and Pvt. George Mancino, in southern France.

Pvt. Valentine G. Imm, 20, is hospitalized of wounds suffered Feb. 21 in action in Italy, his mother, Mrs. Marie Imm, 207 Dewey Ave., has learned. Private Imm entered service in August, 1943 and has been overseas since January.

Marine Pvt. Patry Rosati, 18-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Angelo Rosati, 330 E. Chestnut St., East Rochester, is recovering in a hospital in the Mariana Islands after surgery early last month on Iwo Jima. A member of St. Jerome's parish, East Rochester, Private Rosati went into service in May, 1944 and has been overseas with the Third Marine Division since November.

Marine Lieut. Joseph A. Weber, 28, father of a 6-month-old son he has yet to see, was wounded Feb. 19 on Iwo Jima, according to word received by his wife, Ursula Weber, 369 Hollywood Ave. A graduate of the University of Iowa, Lieutenant Weber entered service in December, 1942 and went overseas in August, 1944.

Pvt. Carmella J. Palermo, 28, member of the Church of the Most Precious Blood, received slight wounds in action Mar. 7 in Germany, his mother, Mrs. Carmella Palermo, 108 Polaris St., has learned. Private Palermo entered service in February, 1941 and has been overseas since September, 1943.

Pvt. George M. Clark, 22, was wounded in action with a combat engineer battalion in Germany Jan. 8, according to word received from his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Walter F. Clark, 54 Glendale Dr., Greece. In service since February, 1942, he has been overseas since October, 1943. Serving with the Merchant Marine in a hospital, Walter M. Clark.

Pvt. Bernard A. Post, 24, whose wife, Evelyn A. Post, is living in Fargo, N. D., was wounded Feb. 21 in France, according to word received from his son of Mr. and Mrs. John J. Previously wounded in France last December, the infantryman holds the Purple Heart. He entered service three years ago and has been overseas since last October. A graduate of Aquinas, he has a son, Michael, 2½ years old, and a brother, Pfc. James G. Callan, is also in Germany.

Staff Sgt. Eugene R. Vogt, 23, graduate of Niagara University, was seriously wounded in action Mar. 15 in Germany, according to information reaching his father, J. William Vogt, 20 Cayuga St. In service two years, Sergeant Vogt went overseas with an infantry unit last November.

Sgt. Norman Haussman, 19, is missing in action for the second time his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Haussman, 121 Orchard St., Webster, have learned. Previously listed missing over Germany he returned safely to his base in Italy and was awarded the Purple Heart for injuries received. He disappeared over Austria this time, the information revealed.

Sergeant Haussman attended Holy Trinity School in Webster, enlisted in February, 1942. Overseas since last November, he has been serving as a tail gunner. He has a brother, Sgt. Edward Haussman, who has been returned to this country after being liberated from captivity by the Italians.

Pfc. William J. Creary, 18, is hospitalized in England of shrapnel wounds in the back and shoulders, suffered Mar. 14 in action in Germany, the War Department has informed his mother, Mrs. Mabel M. Creary, 405 Lake Ave. Private Creary entered service less than four months after graduation from Aquinas Institute last June and went overseas in January.

Pfc. John J. Fedigan, 20, years old paratrooper, son of Mrs. Kathryn Fedigan, 715 Brown St., was slightly wounded in action Mar. 25 in Germany, his mother has been informed. A graduate of Aquinas Institute, he studied at Assumption College before going into service in February, 1943. Private Fedigan has been overseas since last October.

Lieut. Francis G. Polian, 27, co-pilot on a B-24 Liberator, has been missing in action over Germany since Mar. 21, his wife, Mrs. Margaret Polian, 345 Garrison Ave., has learned. A former Aquinas student, Lieutenant Polian went into service in February, 1942 and went overseas in November.
