

3 Catholic Soldiers Dead, 4 Wounded

Three diocesan soldiers have sacrificed their lives, four suffered wounds, two are listed missing in action and two are prisoners, the War Department reports.

Pvt. Lee W. Powers, 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. William J. Powers, 13 Boardman St., gave his life Apr. 1 in action in Germany.

A former pupil of St. Ambrose School, Private Powers had been in service since January, 1943, a 21st overseas since January.

Surviving besides his parents are a brother, 1st Lieut. Robert J. Powers, pilot of a fighter plane based in the Pacific; and two sisters, Mrs. William Roelke and Miss

Rita Marie Powers, a radio nurse at St. Mary's Hospital. Requiem Mass will be offered for Private Powers Saturday at 9 a. m. in St. Ambrose Church.

Requiem High Mass for Pvt. James E. Keegan, 22, who was killed in action Apr. 2 in Germany, was offered in SS. Peter and Paul's Church Tuesday morning, Apr. 17, 1945.

One of five sons of Mr. and Mrs. John J. Keegan, Private Keegan went into service in December, 1942.

He studied under ASTP at Syracuse University and Illinois University and went overseas last November after being transferred to an armored division. He was a graduate of SS. Peter and Paul's School and Aquinas Institute.

Also surviving are his wife, Mrs. Florence Herzog Keegan, 135 Spurling Dr., Greece; a sister, Miss M. Helen Keegan, and his brothers, Pfc. William E. Keegan, AAF, Rapid City, S. D.; John A., Robert E. and Arthur G. Keegan.

S/Mgt. John J. Poole, 29, a native of Auburn, and the son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Poole,

of Auburn, was killed in action Mar. 18 in Germany, his sister, Mrs. Mary Neider, 343 Tremont St., has learned.

A graduate of Aquinas Institute, where he played outstanding basketball, Sergeant Poole went into service in March, 1941, and had been overseas with an armored division since August, 1944.

Surviving, besides his parents, are two brothers, Sgt. Joseph Poole and Pfc. Thomas Poole, both stationed in the Philippines, and two other sisters, Mrs. Veronica Clemens, Syracuse, and Mrs. Cecelia Henson, Auburn. Wounded in action recently in
