Germany, Sgt. Russell E. Schuberl, 23, an Aquinas graduate, has been awarded the Purple Heart. Son of Roy C. Schuberl, 1500 Elmwood Ave., Brighton, Sergeant Schuberl went into service in January, 1943, and has been overseas since October, 1944. His wife, Constance L. Schuberl, resides in Baltimore.

Sgt. Henry J. Mostyn, 36, member of the Fourth Marine Division, is hospitalized at Pearl Harbor of shrapnel wounds suffered Feb. 26 on Iwo Jima, according to word reaching his wife, Mrs. Cecelia Mostyn, 353 Clinton Ave. So. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Mostyn, 161 Alexander St., he went into service on Apr. 20, 1943, and has been overseas since September, 1944.

He graduated from St. Mary's Boys' School.

Word has been received that Pvt. Lorenz Schell, son of Mrs. Mary Schell, 178 Roycroft Dr., was wounded in action Mar. 22 in the Netherlands East Indies. Private Schell entered service February 6, 1943, and was sent overseas in April, 1944. He is a graduate of Aquinas Institute.

Major Frederick J. Mox of the Fifth Marine Division was wounded sometime in March in the Iwo Jima campaign, his father, Frederick Mox, 20 Tomp Ter., a former City Judge, has learned. Entering in August, 1940, Major Mox was first sent overseas in March, 1941, and served with a paratroop regiment in the Solomons campaign and in the fighting for Villa Yella, Chinal and Bougainville. After returning to the States in January, 1944, he was sent overseas again in June. The Major is a graduate of Aquinas Institute and the Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C. He has a brother, Mr. Thomas L. Mox, who is serving with the Third Army in Germany.

Pvt. Richard L. Flanagan, 19, one of a pair of twins in service, has been missing in action in Germany since Mar. 19, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edward L. Flanagan, 219 Bidwell Ter., have learned. Member of a tank battalion, Private Flanagan has been serving overseas since January. A graduate of Aquinas Institute, he entered service with his twin, Edward Flanagan, in August, 1944.

Previously reported missing in action, Pvt. John J. Dugan, 20, is interned by the German Government, according to information received by his mother, Mrs. Rose M. Dugan, 2156 Main St. E. Overseas since March, 1944, Private Dugan has been listed missing with an armored unit since Nov. 17.

Pvt. Stanley Wyszczarski, 23, a former pupil of Holy Ghost School, has been missing in action in France since Mar. 15, his mother, Mrs. Frances Wyszczarski, 1680 Hill Gates Town Line Rd., has been advised. Private Wyszczarski, an infantryman, entered service in August, 1941 and has been overseas since last July. Serving in Germany in his brother, Pvt. Chester Wyszczarski.

Corporal Joseph LaMarche, 25, member of St. Jerome's parish, East Rochester, is a prisoner of the German government after being listed missing in action since Dec. 18, he has notified his brother, Anthony, of Buffalo, husband of Mrs. Joe LaMarche, 215 W. Elm St. Corporal LaMarche was head golf pro at the Locust Hill Country Club when he entered service in June, 1943. Overseas since October, 1944, he was reported missing two days after the German counter-offensive in Belgium. He has a brother, Corp. Samuel LaMarche, who has been overseas 3 years.
