Missing in action in Germany since Mar. 7, Tech. 5th Gr. Louis B. Knoepfer, 23, is safe and well, according to a telegram he sent his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Alois Knoepfer, 471 Trabold Rd., Coldwater Rd.

He entered service in October, 1942 and has been overseas with a medical detachment since November. He is a member of Holy Ghost parish.

T/Sgt. Raymond H. Keller, 26,



son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles J. Keller, 136 Asbury St., has been freed from German imprisonment, his parents have learned.

Sergeant Keller, who had been a prisoner since Sept. 5, 1944, was first reported liberated in a list obtained overseas by a Chicago Tribune correspondent. This was the first word of him received by the parents in 6 months.

An Aquinas graduate, Sergeant Keller entered service in May, 1941. Overseas since June 1944, he took part in 16 missions over enemy territory as engineer on a Liberator bomber.
