Bishop Confirms 2 Classes, Dedicates Parish Memorial

His Excellency, Bishop Kearney conferred the Sacrament of Confirmation in two parish churches in Elmira last Sunday, and dedicated a parish memorial to servicemen.

A class of 90 was confirmed at St. Cecilia's Church at 2 p. m. following which Bishop Kearney blessed the stone statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in the church yard.

An honor guard of Knights of Columbus of the Fourth Degree

Assembly attended the Bishop, and parishioners witnessed the blessing of the memorial, which bears a plaque inscribed with names of soldiers of both World Wars.

Of the 100 veterans of World War I, three were killed and four have died thus far of the 182 performers fighting in World War II.

Twenty-five adults and sixty-four children received the sacrament in Our Lady of Lourdes parish at 5 p. m. Sunday. Following the ceremonies, the Bishop officiated at Solemn Benediction with the Rev. William J. Brien, deacon, and the Rev. Michael L. Hynes, subdeacon, assisting.

The Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree Assembly sent an honor guard to attend the exercises. Benediction hymns were sung by class members accompanied by organist Mrs. Veta Kerr Orr. W. Harold Turner sang special confirmation music.
