**Captures Farmer-Disguised
S.S. Trooper in Germany**

Corning—Pfc. Anthony W. Russo, a member of the Quartermaster Corps of the First Army, somewhere in Germany, in a recent letter to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Aniello Russo, 304 W. West St., described how he captured an S. S. Trooper who was disguised in farmer's clothes.

His letter said in part: "I was out for a very short while and ran across an S. S. Trooper, which is one of Hitler's own army. They tell me they are the best soldiers Hitler has, that's but it is a matter of opinion."

"Chum, a buddy of mine, whose real name is Warren P. Davis, and is from Wrentham, Mass., was walking along side of me. I was carrying on a conversation as usual, when I stopped suddenly because I saw a tall fellow dressed in farmer's clothes about to strike a Russian guard. The fellow had a pitchfork with three full length prongs and one broken prong. He had to creep up to get close to the Russian."

"I didn't know that this fellow was an S. S. soldier because he had his soldier's uniform under his farm clothes. I fired a shot near his head to attract the Russian's attention. When the shot had been fired the S. S. Trooper turned around, put the fork down and put his hands up. From there on it was like any other capture. I had to search him from head to toe and while searching him I found his uniform under the civilian clothes."

"The Russian was so burned up that he began punching the German. He was also so glad that he gave me some vodka."

A member of the Army for three years, Pfc. Russo had been overseas for almost two years.

Two of his brothers, Pfc. Carmo and Pfc. Laska are also in the service. The former is an Infantryman in the First Army and the two brothers have been able to meet fairly often. Pfc. Louis is a member of a B29 crew in the Marianas Islands.
