Solemn Profession of Vows of the Discalced Carmelite Sisterhood will be made by two young women at Carmelite Monastery, 1929 East Ave., on Wednesday, June 6 at 9 a. m.

His Excellency, Bishop Kearney assisted by the Rev. John S. Randall, monastic chaplain, will receive the vows in the solemn ceremony.

Professing their vows will be Sister Gertrude, nee Florence Sullivan, daughter of the late Timothy and Mrs. Catherine Sullivan of East Bloomfield. She is a graduate of Nazareth College. Her sister, Sister St. Catherine of St. Agnes Institute and she has three brothers.

Sister Elias, nee Frances Melody, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Melody of New York City. She is a graduate of Aquinas Hall and was at one time a parishioner of Bishop Kearney's when His Excellency was pastor of St. Francis Xavier. She has three sisters and four brothers of whom Ray Melody is in the Marines and Norman in the Air Corps.

The two sisters have been in Rochester's Carmel for four and a half years and will now make their solemn vows.

Music will be furnished by the choir from Our Lady of Mercy High School under the direction of Sister Margaret Mary.

School Plans Studied In St. Anne's Parish

Plans for the creation of a new parochial school for the children of St. Anne's Church in Brighton have been presented to the parishioners for their consideration by the Rev. George J. Schmitt, pastor.

Release of building materials and final approval of plans by the Diocesan Building Committee must be secured before approaching the work of construction, Father Schmitt stated.

Tentative plans drawn by architect Frank J. Quinlan call for a building which would provide eight classrooms, an auditorium, and a dining room.

Site of the future school will be parish property adjacent to the present rectory on the north side of Brighton Parkway.

Estimating the cost roughly at \$100,000, Father Schmitt disclosed that the parish already has a School Building Fund of \$50,000.

Erected in 1930 by the late Bishop John Francis O'Hern, and the last parish to be started in Rochester, St. Anne's is known as the "Baby Parish" of the city.

At the present time there are approximately 200 Catholic children of school age in St. Anne's Parish. These now attend the public schools of the district and neighboring parochial schools.

Pontiff Authorizes Book on Excavations

Vatican City — (NC) — His Holiness Pope Pius XII received in private audience the archeologist, Professor Enrico Jose, and authorized publication of his book, which documents the excavations undertaken during recent years in the crypt of St. Peter's.

The actual printing of the volume will have to be postponed because of the present difficulties in obtaining printing supplies. In view of the extensive nature of the excavations, publication with great interest, particularly because it will contain documentary proof of the actual location of the Tomb of St. Peter.

Parish Opens \$50,000 Building Fund Campaign

A \$50,000 Building Fund Campaign for St. Margaret Mary's Parish post-war expansion will be conducted from June 5 to June 19, the Rev. Charles J. Bruton, pastor, announces today. Father Bruton has appointed Stanley J. Sroloca, general chairman.

In an unique set-up the Building Fund Campaign will give opportunity to each wage-earner in the parish of contributing a \$5.00 United States War Bond. The goal is \$50,000 in bonds.

Teams are being organized with the parish divided into six divisions headed by Edwin Tetzlaff, Frank Mahler, James Riley, Joseph Schilling, Oswald Bopp and Emmett Kildca.

Father Bruton has appointed Andrew J. Mattie to head the special committee assisted by Edward Springer, Charles Ryan and Rufus Maier, co-chairmen.

Management of the campaign is under the direction of Arthur J. Bamann as Campaign Manager and John M. Blackwood, Co-Manager.

Needs of the parish to be met by the success of the campaign were outlined today by Father Bruton. An overcrowded school will be taxed beyond capacity, he states, because baptismal records show that this September, over 60 pupils will be enrolled in the first grade.

"In 1944," Father Bruton said, "there were 106 infants baptized in our parish which gives some idea of our need for more school room within the next few years. There are 1,800 persons attending Sunday Mass, of the present time, in a church having a capacity of only 460. This overcrowded condition necessitates two Masses, each Sunday, in the School hall."

The Campaign will be given a rousing start at the opening dinner in the school hall, Tuesday, June 5. First report meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 12 and the final victory dinner is on Tuesday, June 19.

In the Sanctuary were the Very Rev. William McPadden, V.F., the Rev. Raymond P. Nolan and the Rev. Edward K. Ball, all of Geneva, and the Rev. George J. Weinmann. The three Geneva priests said the prayers at the grave. Interment was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Besides her daughter in religion, Mrs. Hettel is survived by three other daughters, Mrs. William J. Woerner, Mrs. Fred C. Richner, and Mrs. Lester Corbin of East Rochester; eight grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren; and one brother, William J. Gerstner.
