Franklin Hero Lauds Jewish Doctor, Protestant Chaplain

Boston — (NC) — Five hundred persons attended a public testimonial to Lieut. Comdr. Joseph T. O'Callahan, S.J., hero-

chaplain of the air-craft carrier Franklin, in the auditorium of Cambridge High and Latin School here.

"I can only accept this tribute," Father O'Callahan said, "with the understanding that it is a tribute not to me personally but to the men and fellow officers on the Franklin who sacrificed their lives."

Father O'Callahan paid tributes to two of his comrades aboard the Franklin — a Protestant chaplain and a Jewish doctor. "I want to tell you," he said, "about my colleague, a Protestant chaplain from Texas, Lieut. Grimes W. Gatlin. He was down below when the bomb hit the Franklin. He has been awarded the Silver Star."

"And I want to tell you about Dr. Samuel Sherman, of San Francisco, a Jewish doctor and a very brave man," the priest continued. "He was the first doctor to get to the flight deck." Father O'Callahan said, adding that Doctor Sherman disregarded general orders to leave the stricken carrier so that he could attend the wounded.

Bishop Reported Slain By Reds in Hungary

London — (CIP) — In spite of rigid censorship in Hungary, reliable information has now been received about the recent death of Bishop Vilmos Apor of Győr, Hungary. He was killed by Russian soldiers while defending two women who were being brutally attacked by Red Army men.

Two priests are known to have been killed in Budapest under similar circumstances.

Requiem for U. S. Fliers

Kunming, China — (NC) — The Fourteenth Air Force turned out en masse at the Catholic Cathedral here when a Solemn Requiem Military Mass was offered for its deceased members.

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. John Romanello, a Maryknoll missionary from New Rochelle, N. Y., preached the sermon.

Mission Chapel Campaign Nets \$1800 from Children

Mission endeavors of school children in the Diocese of Rochester were climaxed by a Chapel Drive in connection with the 7th War Loan. The purpose of this drive was the erection of a mission chapel in memory of Sister Theophane in a day possible through the contribution of one 10c War Stamp from each school child.

"The children did a splendid piece of work and through their sacrifices we were able to realize \$1,818.08. There are still thirty-three schools to report. One of the schools donated over \$200, while four others gave over \$100 each," the Mission office reports.

Sister Theophane, in whose memory this chapel is to be erected in New Guinea, was born in Rochester and received her education at St. Michael's School and Nazareth Academy. After finishing her schooling, Sister joined the Missionary Sisters, Servants of the Holy Ghost located at Techy, Illinois.

In 1931 Sister Theophane was sent to New Guinea where she labored for nine years. In 1941 she was interned by the Japanese. Sister was killed in the

stranding of a Jap prison ship, February, 1944. The school children of our Diocese, in memory of this heroic missionary, have made it possible to erect a chapel in the land she loved New Guinea.
