PARISH CAMPAIGN AT HALF-WAY MARK

With postal savings deposits plus the \$50,000 Building Fund Campaign of St. Margaret Mary's parish, the half-way mark is in sight at the end of the first week, drive leaders announced today.

Toppling amount in contributions raised by the various campaign groups were the two districts of James Riley and Oswald Bopp, the former leading with \$3,655 and the latter coming in a close second with \$3,030.

Edward Springer of the squad commanded by Andrew J. Mattie reported \$2,490 in campaign subscriptions.

While pleased with results thus far, general chairman Stanley J. Srokose stated, he must urge campaigners to continue their efforts until the goal is reached.

The campaign will close Tuesday, June 19, with a final report dinner at 6:30 p. m.
