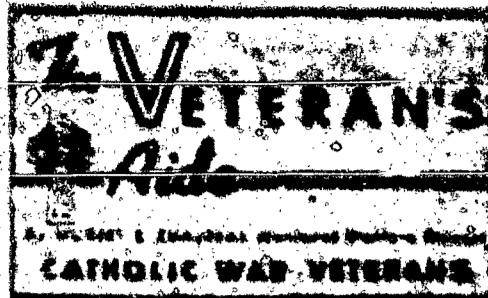


Tops Seneca Falls Schools

Seneca Falls—St. Patrick's Parochial School gained first place in the schools of Seneca Falls in the sale of War Bonds and Stamps during the 1944-45 school year. The total receipts were \$23,429.50. Second place went to Mynderse Academy with sales amounting to \$22,981.63; First Ward School, \$19,437.70, and Elizabeth Cady Stanton School \$1,335.40.

St. Patrick's has every reason to be proud of its record which shows a concentrated effort on the part of the sisters and pupils to do their part in the terminating of the war.

ATTENTION: World War I Veterans, Adjusted Service Bonds which mature on Jan. 15, 1945, may be presented for payment now at the Post Office, Federal Reserve Bank or branch, or directly to the U. S. Treasury, Washington, D. C. These Adjusted Service Bonds were commonly called Bonus Bonds.

Q.—A wife asks who will receive the money in her husband's soldier's deposit account, if he should be killed, his mother or herself?

A.—This deposit account is considered part of a soldier's estate. If he dies it would go to the person he has named as his beneficiary.

Q.—Is a widow of a serviceman who is receiving \$35 per month from her husband's government insurance entitled to a pension for herself and her child? Her husband was killed in action.

A.—A widow and child of a man who dies in the present war are entitled to a monthly pension of \$35, regardless of any other income. National Service Life Insurance payments are not considered as income by the government. The widow's pension is \$35 a month, and would continue until her death or remarriage. The \$15 monthly allowance for the child would continue until the child reaches 18, or 21 if the child is attending school unless the child marries.

Q.—My son was killed in action in the Pacific and named me as his principal beneficiary and he named my youngest son as his contingent beneficiary. At my death would the unpaid balance be part of my estate or would it be paid to my younger son?

A.—When a contingent beneficiary is named, the payments still due at the time of your death would go to the youngest son.

Q.—Can you advise me how many years training a disabled veteran may get under the vocational training program? What allowance also?

A.—The length of vocational

training courses may not exceed four years and must be completed within six years after the end of the war. During authorized training you may receive an allowance of \$20 a month. If you are a single veteran, and married veterans receive \$40.50 a month. Extra allowance of \$5.75 a month for each child and \$11.70 for each dependent parent.

Q.—Where can I get all the

particulars regarding service

members insurance? A.—We have mailed to you the official Veterans Administration booklet on National Service Life Insurance. Readers wishing to secure a copy at no charge may do so simply addressing a post card and ask for the booklet and postal stamp and address plainly booklets on Educational Provisions of the G. I. Bill are also available for the asking.
