

2 Auburn Soldiers Give Lives in Pacific Action

Auburn—Fighting in the Pacific has taken the lives of two Auburn soldiers, one on Okinawa and the other on Luzon, the casualty lists for this week report.

Pfc. Joseph Salvage, 20, son of Mrs. Anna Salvage of Fleming died of wounds received on June 7 on Okinawa. Pfc. Salvage's wife, Mrs. Margery Blake Salvage, lives at 9 Cottage Street. A solemn High Memorial Mass for the young soldier was offered Saturday morning, July 29, in St. Peter and Paul's Church by Rev. Basil Ostasz.

Pfc. Salvage entered the service in May 1943 and left for overseas duty in April, 1944. He has a brother, Michael, who is with the 360th Fighter Group in Germany. Michael has been in the service nearly three years and has been overseas almost since the time of his enlistment.

Pfc. John S. Pele, 37, husband of Mrs. Helen Pele Chapman Avenue, and son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Pele, State Street Road, was killed in action on Luzon in the Philippines on June 27. A Memorial Mass was offered Monday, July 23, at St. Hyacinth's Church by Rev. Vincent Wolski, O.M.C., and a second Mass was sung on Saturday morning. Pfc. Pele was a member of St. Hyacinth's Parish and a graduate of the school.

Pfc. Pele entered the services

on December 15, 1942, and after basic training at Fort McClellan, was sent to San Luis, Calif. He was sent overseas to Hawaii where he was stationed for six months. He was transferred to New Guinea where he took part in two major battles and was awarded the Combat Badge. He then took part in the invasion of the Philippines through Lingayen, Gulf of Luzon and was wounded on January 26 and was sent to General Army Hospital at Leyte for a three month treatment after which he went back into combat and was awarded the Purple Heart.

Pfc. Pele is survived by wife and parents; three brothers, Sgt. Stanley, in Germany, Alphonse and Edward of Auburn; four sisters, Mrs. Mary LaGambino, Mrs. Julio Riccio and Mrs. Pearl Frumento of Auburn and Mrs. Rose Alfred of Fort Byron, and one niece and nephew of Fort Byron.

St. has been listed missing in action over Germany since Apr. 17. A radar specialist, he went overseas in May, 1944, aboard a B-17. He had completed 16 missions.

Pvt. William E. Hunter, 24, of Immaculate Conception parish, was killed in the crash of an hospital evacuation plane on Luzon Mar. 10, his wife, Agnes Mostyn Hunter, 123 Tremont St., has been informed.

Father of three children, Private Hunter enlisted in February, 1944, and went overseas with field artillery.

Besides his children, Arline, 10, Timothy, 4, and Mary, 2, he leaves a brother, Arthur Hunter in the Pacific theater.

Pfc. Raymond J. Bowman, 21, was killed in action in Germany Apr. 18. He is the son of Mrs. Florence Bowman, 99 Holbrook St.

A member of St. Andrew's parish, Private Bowman entered service in July, 1943, and had been overseas since January, 1944. He was wounded last Aug. 3, and returned to action.

Prayer's Power Shown at Sea

The power of prayer was effectively demonstrated aboard an American transport ship at sea by Corp. Joseph A. Caselle, 178 Michigan Street.

New home on furlough, Corporal Caselle served as ship's clerk on the "Sea Scamp." As there was no Catholic Chaplain aboard, the corporal was in the habit of conducting daily recitation of the Rosary.

When he was called upon one night to come to the bedside of a Catholic soldier dying from a brain tumor, Corporal Caselle did the best he could. He drew out his missal and prayed beside his dying comrade for some time.

The men aboard the ship were astounded the following day to find the sick man had regained consciousness. Two days later their wonder increased when he began to eat slowly.

Southern Diocese Plans Ten Churches

Kansas City — (NC) — The first two of ten churches to be built this year in the missionary sections of the Diocese of Kansas City have been dedicated by the Most Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara, Bishop of Kansas City. These churches are being built by contributions from various parishes in the diocese, augmented in each case by a contribution of \$1,500 from the Catholic Church Extension Society. The average cost of construction and furnishing is estimated at \$6,000. The churches are being built in towns for an average congregation of 120 persons who live 20 miles from the nearest Catholic church. The two edifices now completed are located in Mt. Vernon and Cassville, Mo.
