The official permission, stipulated, however, that Rochester must pay to the U. S. Treasury the cost of a regulation flag which is required by Army regulations for military posts.

Mr. Hetzler promptly responded with his personal check to the Treasury Department and this week a large American flag, weighing exactly fifty pounds and measuring 20 by 30 feet arrived at the office of Mayor Dicker.

"The Rochester Flag for Corregidor will remain at the Mayor's office until it is handed over in the public ceremonies to Army officials who will fly it to Corregidor where Rochester soldiers will raise it proudly for the first time over the sight now hallowed by American bravery and sacrifice.
