Navy Doctor Gives Life, Soldier Dies of Polio

A Catholic Naval officer lost his life in the Philippines and an infantryman who had survived after being wounded twice, died here of poliomyelitis.

Surviving besides his parents is his grandmother, Mrs. Fannie Hiller.

He began active service with the Naval Reserve in December, 1942 as a lieutenant commander. Prior to this he had served at the St. Albans Naval Hospital and with the recruiting staff at Newark, N. J.

A graduate of the University of Rochester, the officer received his degree in medicine at Harvard University Medical School and served his internship at St. Mary's Hospital from 1936 to 1939, he was a first lieutenant in the Army Reserve. He was a member of St. Anthony's Church.

16,000 Urged to Take First Aid Refresher

Sixteen thousand letters have been mailed to former First Aiders whose certificates will soon expire, Roy Benson, Director of First Aid, Rochester Chapter, American Red Cross announced today. During Pearl Harbor hysteria all these people took First Aid courses and the need for a five-lesson refresher course is important in the community today.

Chaplain Cleary who has been assigned to the Air Corps said that he would leave for Strasbourg, Germany by plane after the telephone call.

Former Catholic Chaplain at Cornell University, Father Cleary enlisted in the Army in January, 1942. His brother, the Rev. Thomas K. Cleary is stationed in Corning.
