A member of the 21st Photo Reconnaissance Squadron, Sgt. Quirin has served overseas two years and was with the Flying Tigers. He has been three years in the army and received training at Lowry Field, Col. During his two years in China he has been in close touch with the Maryknoll fathers, especially Magr. Romanelli.

His mother, Mrs. Henry Quirin, said her son was expected home within a short time.

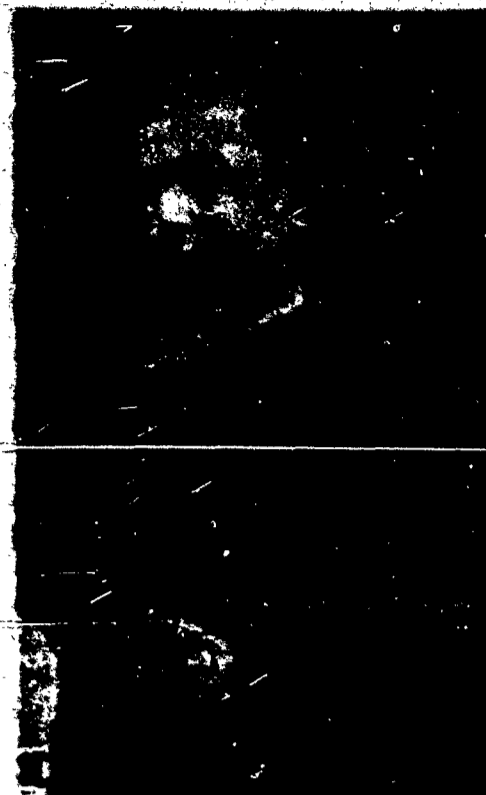

## Fr. Woloch with Fleet in Japan

Auburn — Lt. Commandant John P. Woloch, USNR, Catholic Chaplain is serving on the U. S. S. Don Marston Richard which has been assigned to duty as part of the U. S. occupation fleet in Japan.

For 45 days preceding the end of the war, the vessel steamed up and down the Japanese coast as the Third Fleet staged 13 air raids and five bombardments on the Japanese islands — and fired her guns only once. That was when the almost perfect air

cover permitted a Jap suicide plane to sneak through only to be shot down just short of another carrier. Father Woloch has seen a great deal of action since entering the Navy.
