PICTURE PARADE

LOEW'S ROCHESTER

"**ABBOTT AND COSTELLO IN HOLLYWOOD**" (Family). MGM. If you can take knock-about comedy of their type you'll find the celebrated duo in fair form. Story presumably occurred to Costello while having a shave in studio barber shop. He got Nat Perrin, Martin A. Gosch and Lou Breslow to write it. Abbott and Costello operate a beauty-barber saloon in Hollywood, decide makeup is easiest means to movie fame. They try to promote a new screen hero (Robert Stanton). His success depends upon outsting another movie idol (Carleton C. Young) which they do by semi-hilarious trick of faking a "killing." When the movie idol goes into hiding the two comics induce Mammoth Pictures (looked like MGM studio to me) to star their own "discovery" in his place. Thin tale put over by average comedy routines. Nice looking Frances Rafferty and Jean Porter head supporting cast, with Rags Ragland, Mike Mazurki and Warner Anderson adding good character stuff.

RKO PALACE

"**JOHNNY ANGEL**" (Adults) RKO. If you can get anything out of the cynicism and pseudo toughness of George Raft you may enjoy this despite an unconvincing yarn about a ghost ship which Johnny Angel boards at sea. He discovers his father was the captain and that he evidently has been murdered. Only one person came out alive. She was a mysterious French girl Paulette (Signe Hasso) and while working upon her nerves to solve the mystery of his father's death, Johnny falls for her. Oh Johnny. Oh Johnny. Oh! Claire Trevor as the heavy who is involved in the murder deserves better roles. If Raft likes it this way there's no more to be said for him. He evidently does. He's been playing the same character for twelve years.

"**RADIO STARS ON PARADE**" (Family) RKO. Mostly knock-down and drag-out comedy based on radio programs and

characters. "Truth and Consequences" aired by Ralph Edwards makes the most of "consequences" paid off by unfortunate contestants, but this reviewer would prefer to listen and use his imagination rather than see such slapstick in effect. Frances Langford fans will enjoy her singing and howl fans have Skinny Ennis to drool over. The story however, is a hodge-podge of gags in which strangely unattractive physical specimens, reminiscent of vaudeville twenty years ago, "do their stuff." Innocuous but completely old-fashioned and entirely meaningless.

CENTURY

"**CAPT. EDDIE**" (Family) 20th Century-Fox. The late Winfield R. Sheehan and Christy Walsh, both Catholics, produced this epic story about Rickenbacker. The biography is unfolded in flashbacks as Rickenbacker, magnificently played by Fred MacMurray, and his companions are adrift on the raft in the Pacific. Faith and courage are extolled and, although theological views expressed are sometimes at variance with Catholic teaching, the general drift of the story is good. In rating this for family audiences, the Legion of Decency makes a special annotation which is not intended to discourage patronage of the production of similar screenplays and should not be so interpreted. Definitely a film worth seeing.
