Pontifical Medal Given Field Marshal Alexander

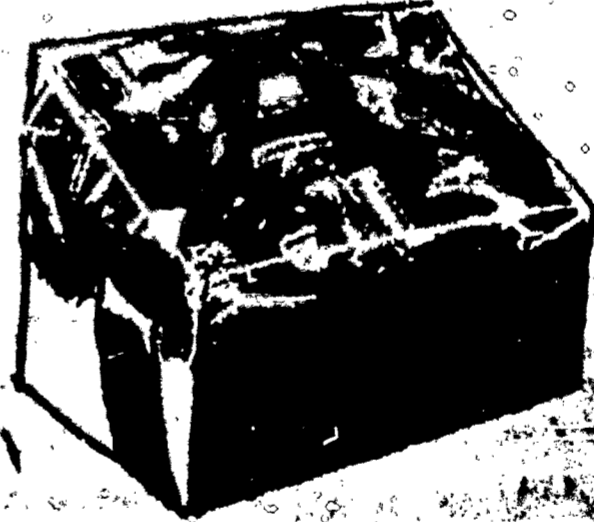
