

Living Rosary at Nazareth Honors Nation's War Dead

A Living Rosary was presented by members of Our Lady's Sodality of Nazareth Academy on Tuesday, Oct. 2, at 3:15 p. m. The Rosary was offered by the Rev. Joseph J. O'Connell, school chaplain, for all those who have died for their country and for the success of the Victory Loan Drive launched in the school on that day.

The cross was turned by mem-

bers of the Central Council, dressed in white formal and led by Sodality Prefect, Rose Marie Kuchman. Each individual bead was represented by a volunteer sodalist clad in a peal formal.

After the entrance procession the group assembled in front of our Lady's Shrine which was covered with white gladioli.

The recital of each Hail Mary was marked by the lighting of successive candles in the hands of the girls representing the beads, thus forming in the darkened auditorium, a blazing symbol of the Sodality's devotion to Mary.

An Act of Consecration to Mary, the salute to the flag, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament closed the ceremony. As the recessional wound its way through the auditorium, the entire group of about 300 Sodalists sang the Ave Maria.

Praised for Aid To European Jews

Washington — (NC) — The assistance of the Holy See and Catholic Bishops throughout Europe was "invaluable" to the efforts of the War Refugee Board in aiding persecuted Jews in Nazi dominated nations, Gen. William O'Dwyer said in his final report as executive director of the board.

General O'Dwyer said that the nations and the Catholic hierarchy "were solicited time and again for special assistance both as channels of communication to the leaders and people of enemy territory and as a means of rendering direct aid to the suffering victims of Hitler."

"The Catholic clergy," he reported, "saved and protected many thousands and the Vatican rendered invaluable assistance to the board and to the persecuted in Nazi hands."

Catholic Pupils Top War Savings Sales 25 P.C. Over Average

Washington — (NC) — The September issue of "Schools at War," a quarterly news bulletin of the War Finance Division of the U. S. Treasury, states that in War Bond and Stamp sales since Pearl Harbor, "Catholic schools have hung up a particularly fine record with per pupil totals averaging about 25.5 per cent above the national average."

Nurses Aides Needed

There is an urgent need to train 125 Red Cross Volunteer Nurses Aides for work in the hospitals in Rochester. Nurses have not returned into hospital service as yet, many who have been overseas are tired, have battle fatigue and feel that they cannot do themselves nor the hospital justice in taking on the work right now. There is an ever increasing number of patients entering the hospitals now, with a decreasing number of volunteers. Many Nurses Aides have left to join their husbands who have returned from service overseas, many have married Army.

The war may be over but community service must go on. The training of a nurse aide can be in a few weeks and give some 10 persons needed care.

The age limit is 18 to 35 years, by calling Nurses Aide, 2204 4th St., or your own Red Cross branch.
