### Group Plan Catholic Theater in Rome

Rome (RNS) — Italian business men and impresarios have approached the Catholic Theatre Centre here with a plan to organize a Catholic theatre in Rome where great stage masterpieces acceptable from the religious viewpoint may be performed.

As an outcome of the offer, Pope Pius XII is expected shortly to give an audience to a group of 100 actors and actresses. The newly-organized *Borbone* Company has meanwhile requested the moral support of the Catholic Theatre Centre for a repertoire including Eugene O'Neill's "Days Without End," a play reflecting the author's Catholic outlook.
