Foreign Commissar Molotov tried to shove off on U.S. Secretary of State Byrnes and British Foreign Minister Ernest Bev. ins the blame for failure of the Conference of Foreign Ministers England in 1940. in London.

The Soviet Press indicated irritation with Mr. Byrnes' explamation of the Conference to the American people,

The Soviet press also invelghed agsinst American administration of its zone of occupation in Germany, charging that it was stripping German Industrial plants and promoting the return of German imperialism,

The spokesman of Communism in Korea called upon the American occupation to get out The Moscow radio resumed its gross attacks upon Catholics, of whom there are more than 23. 000,000 in the United States.

Publications and commentators in this country sympathetic to leftists blasted away at the United States for its policy with regard to Europe and gave fulsome support to the Russians for their stand at the London Conference.

In Japan, Communists released from prison by order of General MacArthur began a vocilerous campaign, one of the aims of which is the removal of the Emperor, a course would seriously hamper if not ruin the excellent progress of General MacArthur's administration.

At the same time Russia Itself pressed for the replacement of MacArthur's regime with a multi-headed supervision.


