The Rev. Albert J. Shamon has been named to succeed the Rev. Leo C. Mooney as Moderator of Rochester Diocesan Council, National Council of Catholic Women. It is announced at the council's headquarters, this week.

Father Shamon is assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church, Rochester, and faithful friar of Rochester Assembly, Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus. He was ordained in June, 1940.
