

Released-Time Legality Upheld in Los Angeles

Los Angeles — (RNS) — The legality of released-time religious activities in the public schools of Los Angeles was upheld here by County Counsel Harold Kenney, the Board of Education's legal adviser. He warned, however, that care should be taken in administering the program.

The county's counsel's opinion was given after a local attorney charged that the program fostered "sectarian antagonism and intolerance." The charge was denied by the local Interfaith Committee on Released Time Provisions.

RKO PALACE

"STATE FAIR" * (Family)**
20th Century-Fox. Philip Stong's highly colored novel, filmed dramatically by the late Winfield R. Sheehan ten years ago, now is brilliantly converted into a romantic musical by Oscar Hammerstein II and Richard Rodgers under the production aegis of William Perleberg. Beautifully done in technicolor, it captures the spirit of the State Fair as experienced by the Frake family without recourse to the doubtful amorous adventures suggested by the author of the novel. A clear illustration that a code of ethics plus imagination leads to better movie entertainment. Tip top performances by Dana Andrews, Jeanne Crain, Dick Haymes, Charles Winniger and Fay Bainter. Go and take the family.

LOEW'S ROCHESTER

"THE SOUTHERNER" * (Adults)** United Artists. Graphic and at times poignant study of poor cotton-picking family struggling against poverty and adverse elements to raise cotton on their own land. Transcendent virtue of the story lies in its portrayal of characters more worthy than those met in most movies about well-nourished and successful people. The unselfishness, faith, honor and loyalty of these poor cotton-pickers light up an otherwise depressing and starkly realistic examination of bad social conditions. Great performances by Zachary Scott, Betty Field, Beulah Bondi, J. Carroll Naish, Charles Kemper, Blanche Yurka and Percy Kilbride. Sensitively directed by Frenchman Jean Renoir, the screenplay by Hugo Butler is vividly translated from the George Seaton Perry novel "Hold Autumn in Your Hand." If you like movies about real people, see it.

CENTURY

"THE HOUSE ON EMD STREET" ** (Family) 20th Century-Fox. Effective use is made of FBI records dealing with apprehension of Nazi agents in U. S. A. It is virtually super "March Of Time" about the FBI. Cast of actors headed by William Wyler, Lloyd Nolan, Signe Hasso, Gene Lockhart and Lydia St. Clair, provides leading characterizations with FBI personnel under actual working conditions during the war. The case of Elsa Gebhart, Johanna Schmidt and company, who were brought to justice earlier in the war, is taken by producer Louis de Rochemont, well-known producer of "March Of Time," as basis of part documentary, part newsreel and part fictional film in which narrative covers much of the action. It is difficult to discern where documentation begins and fictionalization begins; but the enemy agents are shown engaged in espionage on atom bomb secrets, so the story cannot be an authentic as a screen possible suggests. All the same it makes an excellent and, at times, most gripping picture. Readers high tribute to the sagacity of the FBI but open question whether it had large to then see the results in this regard as quickly as possible.
