PICTURE PARADE

LOEW'S ROCHESTER
"CAPTAIN KIDD" (Family)
United Artists, Benedict Bogdan production based on celebrated pirate story with Charles Laughton as Captain William Kidd, Randolph Scott as Adam Mercy and Barbara Britton as Lady Ann Falconer. Cut to current

pattern of escapism and not so expertly done that audiences may not feel urge to escape. Laughton in usual blustering stride. Fairly effective backgrounds but sometimes tedious direction. Take or leave proposition.

"ADVENTURE OF COLONEL BLIMP" **** (Adults) United Artists. Sensitive and intelligent screenplay filmed in Britain over three years ago but still undated. Traces career of typical fighting man through three military campaigns and in comedy vein; assails his code of honor among enemies, with eventual justification of right principles. Diction and characterization at times rather difficult for uninitiated American audiences to follow although the underlying meaning is powerful. Pace is deliberate but interest is maintained through penetrating analysis of human character and ideals in conflict with the demoralizing trends of modern warfare. Wonderful performances by Roger Livesey as the Colonel, Anton Walbrook as a German officer who after a duel became the Colonel's lifelong friend, and Deborah Kerr, a natural beauty. Finely shaded supporting cast also. Well worth seeing as out-of-the-rut movie entertainment.

"THE DOLLY SISTERS" *** (Objectionable in Part) 20th Century Fox. Dramatized biography of the famous Dolly Sisters with Betty Grable as Jenny and June Haver as Rose. Expertly produced in technicolor and directed, with emphasis on romance, by Irving Cummings. Traces lives of the two entertainers from their arrival in USA with "Uncle Latale" from Budapest, through their theatrical heyday to eventual retirement. Welling up through the story is a potent interrogation of distorted values created in the show business. Jenny, married to Harry Fox (John Payne) wrecks her happy marriage and sues for divorce rather than break up the sister act to return with him from Paris to America. This struggle between the petty vanities of career and the deeper realities of life shows up throughout. Rose almost loses the love of Irving Netcher (Frank Latimore) because "the show must go on." June Haver gives strong competition, both as dancer and singer.

er, to Betty Grable. The Haver personality is softer, more charming and cultured. Although Miss Grable is starred, the little Haver girl gets away with the better part of the picture. There are exotic stage sequences covering the Fallos Bergers with the Dolly Sisters starring and several nostalgic songs of 1904 to 1920 are hauntingly repeated through the tale. Biography is not literal but net result is excellent entertainment of the spectacular musical type.

"FIRST YANK INTO TOKYO"
(Adults) RKO. Unconvincing story of an American airman who volunteers to undergo plastic surgery giving him the face of a Japanese in order to infiltrate Japan and recover from imprisoned American scientist, test data on the atomic bomb. Palpable afterthought exploitation of atomic developments has been infused into routine "B" class melodrama. Tom Neal does nicely as the fake Jap but the make-up is crudely ineffective. Barbara Hale and Richard Loo give excellent support with Keye Luke, Chinese actor, outstanding in unusual comedy role. Young men who follow Dick Tracy will love it!
