Czechs Kneeling in Prague Streets Honor St. Wenceslaus

Prague (NC) — Tens of thousands of Catholics, representatives of the Czechoslovak government and of other nations, attended the traditional religious ceremonies and processions in honor of St. Wenceslaus, patron saint of the Czechs, which had been banned during the war.

Thousands knelt in the flag-decked streets of the ancient capital as the relics of St. Wenceslaus were carried in a small gold
