Ken Mackenzie is a Swell Fellow... But...

Ken Mackenzie is a swell fellow — but he's no fool! When J. B. knocked Ken's hat off for the third time in as many minutes, Ken called it quits on J. B.'s successive apologies. Ken presumed — and rightly — that J. B.'s apologies were in the same category as the proverbial "Good Morning" and "You bet" — mere formalities. Unfortunately for Catholic J. B. — if there are any God doesn't presume that the mere telling of sins to a duly authorized priest implicitly includes the necessary dispositions for pardon. Every Catholic knows this. In fact, every Catholic child knows from "perny catechism" days that his apology made to Almighty God in the confessional must not only be sincere — but entire and humble as well. Sorrow for sin is a hatred of sin and a true grief of soul for

having offended God, with a firm purpose of sinning no more. (Baltimore Catechism).

A true apology implicitly includes the intention of not repeating the offense for which it is made. In the confessional the Catholic actually expresses the fixed resolve to avoid all persons, places and things which may be the cause of his offending God his Father in the future through sin.

When you see your Catholic neighbor returning to the confessional again and again, remember that God alone knows the terrific temptations that may surround him in this work-a-day world of ours where the devil, as St. Peter warns us "goes about like a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour."

Remember the words of Christ addressed to the apostles when they would establish a limit to forgiveness. Not seven, but seventy times seven shalt thou forgive thy brother. In other words — always provided he is thoroughly sorry and repentant.

Yes, Ken Mackenzie is a swell fellow — BUT he's no fool. So, too, God is Good — in fact infinitely Good — but He is not deceived by the Act of Contrition which proceeds from the lips, but not from the heart. Every Catholic knows this simple truth. Therefore, he refrains from judging his brother lest he himself fall under greater judgment. — (Catholic Information Society of New York.)

Catholic Press Group To Convene in Boston
Chicago — Boston is the 1946 convention city for the Catholic Press Association. This decision was announced here at the conclusion of a two-day session of the association's Executive Board. Last year it was decided to hold the 1945 convention in Boston, but in cooperation with the war effort the association paid heed to the Government's request and no convention was held this year.

The Most Rev. Richard J. Cushing, Archbishop of Boston, cordially renewed his invitation, for 1946, and it was unanimously accepted, the Rev. Patrick O'Connor, S.S.C., president of the association and editor of The Far East, St. Columban mission magazine, announced.

The Most Rev. John Gregory Murray, Archbishop of St. Paul and Episcopal Chairman of the Press Department of the National Catholic Welfare Conference, participated in the sessions of the Board, which covered a wide range of press advancement plans. The associate membership of the association was more than doubled during the year. It was reported, chiefly through the efforts of the association's new executive secretary, James A. Shanahan.

Retired Bishop Dies, Governed 2 Dioceses
BOSTON, Mass. (AP) — Bishop Richard J. Cushing, who governed the dioceses of Boston and Lowell, died at his home in Boston on Wednesday, Nov. 14, at the age of 87.

Bishop Cushing, who was born in Lowell, Mass., in 1858, was ordained a priest in 1881 and served in various parishes before being named Bishop of Lowell in 1901. He was transferred to Boston in 1910 and served as Bishop of Lowell from 1910 to 1912.

Bishop Cushing was a member of the National Council of Bishops and the American Bishops' Conference. He was also a member of the Pontifical Commission for the Study of the Problem of the Holy See's Relations with the United States.
