 The War Department was in-  
 formed by its military government in  
 Germany to furnish shipment of  
 200,000 additional tons of food.

Swiss Catholics moved to or-  
 ganize relief for Central Europe  
 on a big scale.  
 Two shipments called on Brit-  
 ain's Prime Minister Attlee to  
 ask Government action for re-  
 lief in central Europe.

The Government of the pro-  
 jected additional shipments of  
 foodstuffs "is over on grounds"  
 to supplement those already sent.

These three 100,000 tons in the  
 United States, it was announced,  
 have already in the company of  
 other relief shipments, 200,000  
 to relief and also 200,000 tons  
 of foodstuffs to war-torn peo-  
 ple throughout the world.
