**CAPITOL**  
 "FALLEN ANGEL" \*\* (Obj. in part) 20th Century-Fox. The two-star indication, "good," relates to cast and technique and not to story or characters which, with three exceptions, are disgustingly unprincipled. Cynical Jack-of-all-trades (Dana Andrews) visiting small town as advance press agent for a phony spiritualist (John Carradine) meets waitress (Linda Darnell) in cheap cafe. Other plans having failed he offers her marriage. She accepts subject to a change in his financial position. She wants marriage with money. This man then woos and marries a decent girl (Alice Faye) member of a socially prominent and highly respected family, bent on getting her fortune to attract the waitress. When the waitress is murdered he is suspected but, with chameleon-like change of character, he turns detective, clears himself, apprehends the killer and (so conveniently) picks up married life with the bride he has so grievously wronged. Excellent performances by the principals fail to retrieve the story adapted from Marty Holland's novel. Although Officials of the Code Administration disagree, this critic finds violations of the Code in parts of this picture.

**St. Bon's Medical Research Gains Fame**

St. Bonaventure, N. Y. — (INC) — Results of research work on rheumatic fever carried on for the past two years at St. Bonaventure College have caused wide interest outside the campus. Dr. Maria Gross, of Yale University's Laboratory of Applied Physiology, is among many who have recognized value of recent studies of the St. Bonaventure College School of Nursing in which findings were published. Research in the chemotherapy of rheumatic fever and substitute bacterial endocarditis has been done by Professor Harold J. Torrey and Mrs. Jean Davis Wood. Dr. Gross is editor of "Critical Reviews of Medicine and Biology" through which he plans to make the St. Bonaventure findings readily available to the medical profession.
