LOEW'S ROCHESTER
"WEEK END AT THE WALDEN" ** (Adults). MGM. Originally but intelligently produced by Arthur Hornblow. Presents sophisticated characters week ending in vulgarly luxurious hotel. Lana Turner, public stenographer; Ginger Rogers, film star; Walter Pidgeon, war correspondent; Van Johnson, doomed war hero; Edward Arnold, financial

shyster; George Zucco, visiting Bey, etc. Romantic, mercenary and political pursuits contrasted on Grand Hotel lines, with no special emphasis upon strict codes of morality. Society film-de-luxe. Not for conservative tastes.

RKO PALACE
"MILDRED PIERCE" * (Objectionable in part.) Warners. Skillfully presented but depressing story of devoted mother and delinquent daughter. Joan Crawford does well as the mother with Ann Blyth, an obvious discovery, as the daughter. Divorce and re-marriage seem to be accepted. Situation between daughter and step father is in questionable taste. The mother's insistence upon giving her daughter "the good things of this world" in place of proper moral training, forfeits sympathy for the character and robs the story of conviction. Directed for suspense and surprise by Michael Curtiz. Very fine acting by Zachary Scott, Jack Carson, Bruce Bennett and Eve Arden. Should convey a moral to parents not to spoil children by seeking for them "the easy way" through life.

Fr. Hubbard in 'Post War Alaska' Lecture Dec. 3

Opportunities opened up for life in post-war Alaska will be discussed by the Rev. Bernard Hubbard, S.J., famed "glacier priest," in his lecture Monday, Dec. 3, at the Auditorium. There will be a matinee at 3:30 p. m. and the evening lecture is at 8:15 p. m.

Father Hubbard, who recently returned from a tour of European battlefields, was originally scheduled to appear Nov. 19 but was forced to cancel the date because of illness.

A keen observer and reporter, the priest will relate his experiences during his journey through Italy, France, Austria, Germany, Belgium, Holland and Belgium.

While in Italy, he was received by His Holiness, Pope Pius XII, whom he presented with a miniature ivory reproduction of the statue of Christ, the Light of the World, which stands on King Island in the Bering Strait.

Motion pictures of Alaskan life and scenery photographed in cinelcolor will be shown.

Pearl Harbor Sermon Will be Broadcast

New York (NC) — The sermon of Bishop James J. Sweeney of Honolulu at the annual Pearl Harbor Day memorial service will be broadcast nationally on Dec. 7 from 3:45 to 4 p. m. It has been announced by the Columbia Broadcasting System.

The Bishop's sermon will follow a Solemn Pontifical Mass offered at Block's Arena on the spot where the United States was plunged into World War II, for the repose of the souls of all who lost their lives there on December 7, 1941, and for all World War II dead. The memorial service has been conducted annually since 1942. A congregation of from 7,500 to 10,000 persons customarily attends.
