Funeral services for T/Sgt. Bernard F. Meyering, 23, an Aquinas graduate, were conducted Monday morning, Nov. 26, 1945 in Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church. Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Sergeant Meyering died Saturday, Nov. 17, at General Hospital, San Francisco of an illness contracted while serving overseas.

A member of the 79th Combat Engineers Battalion, the young sergeant was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred H. Meyering, 245 Norton St.

He entered service on Jan. 11, 1943, going overseas in January 1944 where he participated in the battles of Marilla and Huklandia.

He was an active member of the parish Holy Name Society and the Dramatic Club.

Active in the Boy Scout movement, Sergeant Meyering in 1941 conducted with Fred Heffer the "Scouting For Catholics" column in the COURIER JOURNAL.

Surviving besides his parents are two sisters, Ruth and Agnes Meyering and a brother, Raymond.
