### Chaplain Woloch To Leave Service

After more than four years in the Navy, Chaplain John F. Woloch, Lieutenant Commander, USNR, has left this big aircraft carrier for discharge.

Chaplain Woloch left St. Mary's Church, Corning, N. Y., in the fall of 1941 to enter the Navy and is a veteran of Pearl Harbor and Midway as well as the final sea-air onslaught against the Jap homeland.

Father Woloch is a native of Auburn, N. Y., where his mother, Mrs. Rose Ann Woloch, lives at 48 Pulaski St. He attended Kanty College, Erie, Penna., and St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester, N. Y. Before his assignment at Corning, he served at the Mt. Carmel and St. Stanislaus Churches in Rochester, N. Y.

### Priest Heads Scientists

Montreal — (NC) — The Rev. J. W. Laverdiere, new president of the French Canadian Association for the Advancement of Science, is a distinguished priest-scientist. On the Science Faculty at Laval University, he is also a member of geological societies in France, a Fellow of the Geological Society of America, a member of the Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy, the Paleontological Society of America and the International Geographical Union.

### Bishops' Paper Studied by Verein

Rochester Branch, Catholic Central Verein of America at its regular monthly meeting held Sunday afternoon at St. Joseph's Hall, discussed the Bishop's statement "Between War and Peace." The discussion was led by Joseph H. Gervais, attorney, who pointed out that this was probably one of the most significant statements issued by the Bishops of the United States following their annual conferences. He called particular attention to the description of Italy as being today "an Outpost of Western Civilization."

William J. Fuehrer, August M. Master and Louis Ammering took part in the floor discussion.

It was announced that the card party originally scheduled for Nov. 29 had been postponed to January 9.

Harry deCoen reported on plans his committee was making for a membership drive.

The committee arranging for the annual Mass in memory of Rev. Jacob Staub reported that plans had been made for the Mass to be said at Holy Redeemer Church on Jan. 20.

The meeting instructed the secretary to write Representatives in Congress, asking that postal communications with Germany be resumed as quickly as possible.

William J. Wittman presided. Rev. Charles Guittenberger, C. S. S. R., spoke briefly at the close of the meeting and complimented the members for their excellent discussion. He exhorted them to continue to proclaim the truth, and stated that the time had now come "when we, who possess the truth, must make our voices heard."

### Strasbourg Cathedral Windows Recovered

Paris — (NC) — The stained glass windows of the Cathedral of Strasbourg which were discovered inside Germany have been returned to the Bishop of Strasbourg through the efforts of the U. S. Seventh Army. A solemn ceremony which thousands of Alsatians attended marked the occasion.

The facades of the Cathedral were decorated with French and American flags to show the people's gratitude to U. S. Army authorities. The windows are a work of the XII century, depicting the Way of the Cross and a series of French emperors and kings.

### Mass Held in Rome for Tubercular War Veterans

Rome (RNS) — A special Mass was celebrated when 380 tubercular war veterans arrived on a hospital train here on their way to Palermo for treatment. The men are being cared for by the Vatican Relief Commission in cooperation with Allied authorities. The Mass was said by Mgr. Baldelli, who blessed the train and extended the Pope's benediction to the patients aboard.

### Catholic Publication To Appear in Berlin

Berlin — (RNS) — American occupation authorities have given permission for publication of a new Catholic periodical in Berlin. It will be the first enterprise of its kind since the suppression of the Catholic press under the Nazi regime.

The Catholic publishing firm of Herder and Company, in Freiburg, is reported preparing to release a new monthly "Christian Germany," which will have a circulation of 100,000 copies. It is expected that this new publication will be the first to appear in Germany since the end of the war.
