National Marian Congress Slated

Washington, D. C. (RNS) — A nationwide Marian Congress will be organized on Mother's Day, May 12, in connection with the centennial of the selection of the Blessed Virgin, under her title of the Immaculate Conception, as patron saint of the United States. The committee in charge is headed by the Rev. John J. Reilly, director of the national shrine of the Immaculate Conception at the Catholic University of America, where the congress will be held.

Marian congresses have been held regularly in the United States and other countries to stimulate devotion to the Mother of God, and to demonstrate loyalty to her under her various titles. They bring together members of the Legion of Mary, sodalities, and other church associations dedicated in her honor.

City Jail Made Into a Church

Swanton, Neb. — (NC) — Add this to the list of unusual stories produced by the housing shortage: the Catholics of this Nebraska community have taken over the abandoned city jail and converted it into a church.

The Swanton congregation, organized in July, had been holding its services in a rented hall. Deciding that they wanted a church of their own they looked around town for a suitable structure and came across a small building which had served as the city jail.

Although reconditioning is only partly completed and there are scarcely any pews or statuary or other furnishings, services have been held in the structure since November 1.

Italy Has New 'Don Bosco'

New York — (CIP) — A new Don Bosco has risen in Italy, and people in Rome, Catholics and non-Catholics alike, are talking with amazement and admiration about the way in which he has been re-educating the boys of the street, many of whom were, not so long ago, thieves, robbers, beggars, and black market operators.

Don Antonio Rivolta, a Roman priest belonging to the St. Paul Society, has gathered them together and organized the Children's Village at Santa Marinella, on the Italian sea coast, not far from Rome. Father Rivolta hopes to start many more "villages" of this kind. A Christmas lottery is expected to supply part of the financial means needed.

The Children's Village of Santa Marinella is a school of applied democracy. It has its own "mayor," who is twelve years old, "councilmen" who are freely elected by their comrades, "judges" and "guards," all of whom are carrying out the duties of their office conscientiously and efficiently. There are "elections" every month, so that many boys get an opportunity to learn how to "hold office" and exercise authority.

Of the few grownups in the village, the most important are: the Director, who is a layman; a priest who acts as chaplain and teacher; and a married couple acting as father and mother to the children and affectionately known as Uncle Peter and Aunt Mary.

"Laws" are made by the Village Council, "decrees" are issued by the "mayor," and trespassers are arrested by the "guards." The number of such arrests has decreased rapidly, and now the "guards" have to intervene only very infrequently because all the "citizens" of the Village make it a point of honor to be law-abiding.

Friends of Frank Fay To Hold Rally Jan. 10

New York — (NC) — Friends of Frank Fay, well-known actor, who recently denounced the attendance of five members of the Actors Equity Association at a Spanish Refugee Appeal rally at Madison Square Garden here, at which an address broadcast from London, by Harold L. Laski, chairman of the British Labor Party, attacked the Vatican and the Catholic Church in Spain, have announced plans for a mass meeting at the Garden on January 10 to bring the case of Frank Fay before the American people.

Mr. Fay has contended that the five Equity members had participated in an attack on his religion. They replied by filing written charges with the Equity Council, alleging that Mr. Fay's conduct was "prejudicial to the welfare of the association and its members." When the council sustained the charges preferred by the accused members and reprimanded Mr. Fay, the actor appealed to the entire membership for a hearing.

A membership meeting called to consider Mr. Fay's appeal against the council ruling resulted in the Association's voting to uphold the decision of their governing body in their censure of Mr. Fay.

British Critics Hail 2 Young Irish Tenors

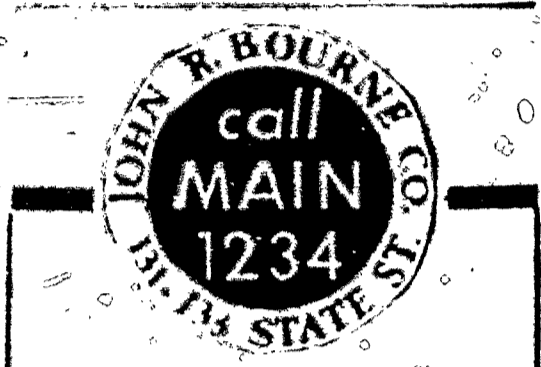
London — (NC) — The work of two young Irish Catholic tenors has been attracting the attention of music critics of London newspapers recently.
