Fr. Bolger Home From Philippines

Coming from Mindoro in the Philippine Islands, Chaplain William Dorey Bolger, division chaplain of the 96th Infantry Division, reached his Rochester home in time for Christmas. Father Bolger left Wednesday for Fort Dix and will return to the city for a 45-day furlough after which he will return to Army duty.

Father Bolger who has the rank of Captain is expected to be in the Army until June, 1947. He enlisted in October, 1942, after serving a short time as assistant pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church, Rochester. Prior to that he had been assistant to the Rev. Charles J. Bruton, pastor of St. Margaret Mary's Church, Irondequoit.

Commissioned a First Lieutenant he served at Camp Shelby, Miss., and later went to the Hawaiian Islands where he celebrated Mass for the lepers on Molokai. A year ago Christmas he, with Chaplain Gervase McMillen, O.F.M., of St. Bonaventura College, participated in Midnight Mass in Church of the Immaculate Conception, Gulan, Samar, in the Philippines. Since then Captain Bolger has been serving on Mindoro.

Moscow Reunion Bid Weighed

Chicago — (CRNS) — The Council of Bishops of the Russian Orthodox Church in America will shortly announce its decision on proposals submitted by Archbishop Alexei of Yaroslavl and Rostov for re-union of the so-called dissident Church with the Moscow Patriarchate.

The bishops held a two-day meeting here on the proposals, but neither Archbishop Alexei nor Metropolitan Theophilus, head of the American Russian Church, would make any comment on the probable outcome of the conference. Earlier, however, Metropolitan Theophilus told Religious News Service that he expected the bishops to reject the Moscow proposals.

"We American bishops feel that while our ritual and doctrines are the same as those of our Russian brethren, we should not in any way enter into any alliance which might have political implications," he said.

"Most of us feel that the Russian Orthodox clergy of this country should keep out of politics completely, and work entirely within a spiritual sphere."

Pope Receives General

Rome — (CRNS) — Pope Pius XII gave an audience to Major General Edgar Tasker Hume, former head of the American Military Government in Rome, and at present in charge of the American command in Austria. General Hume returned to Rome to spend Christmas there.

Vatican Council Extension Seen Possible by Theologian

Rome — (CIP) — Father Filograssi, Professor of Dogma at the Papal Gregorian University, questioned by a correspondent about the likelihood of a resumption of the Vatican Council, made the following statement: "Pius XI did not wish to open a new Council, but wanted to continue the Vatican Council which was adjourned but not closed in 1870. He announced this in his first encyclical, 'Ubi Arcano Dei,' in 1922.

"It is therefore certain that as soon as possible the Vatican Council will be called together again, because the Church feels the need for it, to clarify certain doctrinal positions against recent errors as well as for the promotion of spiritual and religious life and for a further clarification of the attitude of the Church towards the modern States and the vicissitudes of this turbulent era in history."
