Response of the National Council of Catholic Women to the War Relief Services-N. C. W. C. appeal for clothing for Europe, the Philippines and China is described as "magnificent" in the New Year's message of the N. C. C. W. national president, Mrs. Thomas G. Garrison.

The need for clothing for the children and Sisters of Europe and the Far East is a continuing one, however, writes Mrs. Garrison. "During the coming months," she urges, "let us increase our efforts to relieve the victims in war-torn countries suffering from want and cold."
