

Returning Troops Urged To Be Apostles of Reality

London — (AP) — Swing America away from a shallow intellectual smartness by offering it the influence and example of real men, U. S. troops returning from Europe were urged in a Catholic program broadcast over the American Forces Radio Network.

The plea was made by Msgr. Robert J. Sherry, of Cincinnati, Army chaplain at the American Forces' University in England. He spoke in the last broadcast of a regular Catholic Service of the Air from the university, which is being closed down. Many prominent English Catholic writers and lecturers have been among speakers on the program.

In the United States there has grown up a particular habit of thought which is changing the national point of view on mar-

riage, children, authority and religion, Father Sherry said, adding that "for the want of a better name it might be called intellectual smartness; a blending of affectation with the cheap superiority of ignorance."

They are a loud and presumptuous group, he said, describing college professors who "grub after facts until the all-pervading truth has escaped." Father Sherry also included the glorified reporters, smart scribblers "who lead the public more directly by the nose," and some scientists, philosophers and historians, whom he called "people of little faith but of infinite credulity."

He urged the American soldiers to be apostles of reality.

Clearing Cassino Abbey Cost High

Rome — (HNS) — Four million lire have already been spent in clearing debris from the Benedictine Abbey of Monte Cassino which was destroyed during the war. A temporary monastery has been erected outside the main entrance to house monks during the time it will take to rebuild the famous shrine.

Eight Benedictine monks are employed in removing litter from the courtyards. Recently the monks excavated the chapel of St. Benedict, which was buried in debris, but found to be virtually undamaged. Mass is being said there every morning for Polish workers who are completing the cemetery in the so-called Death Valley of Monte Cassino, where those who died in the assault on the Abbey are interred.

In tribute to the eleven hundred Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, and Jewish Poles who were killed in the final phases of the attack, Polish soldiers have donated 20 million lire toward the reconstruction of the Benedictine monastery. Complete restoration is expected to cost at least two billion lire.

Frank Reported Leaving Church

Washington — (NC) — Press reports from Nuremberg state that Hans Frank, German Governor-General during the occupation of Poland, who is reported to have embraced the Catholic faith while in jail last October, has indicated that he will leave the Church because the Vatican has provided documents as evidence to the Military Tribunal.

The reports state that Frank submitted three questions to the Tribunal through his attorney. The questions sought to determine whether the Vatican is a signatory to the charter governing the trial; whether the Vatican knew how the documents would be used by the prosecution and whether the Vatican allied itself with the prosecution's charges.

The attorney said that upon the answers to the questions depended Frank's further adherence to the Church. The court, after consultation on the questions, declined to entertain them on the ground they were "irrelevant," the reports state.

Church Unity Week Opens Tomorrow

Washington — (NC) — Joining with millions throughout the world in the observance of the Church Unity Octave, the Catholic University Conference of Clerics and Religious has prepared a program in which five bishops and a number of outstanding orators will participate, for the thirteenth annual observance in the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception here, January 18 to 25.

The local observance of the Octave has become known as the national celebration. Other major observances will be staged in New York, Chicago, Boston, Cleveland, Baltimore, Altoona and Buffalo. The United States is the home of the world-wide prayer movement.

Highlight of the local observance, following the custom of previous years, will be the Celebration of the Pontifical Liturgy according to the Byzantine Slavonic Rite, on Sunday, January 28, by Bishop Ambrose Kenny, O.S.B.M., Auxiliary of the Ukrainian Catholic Diocese of the United States.

Bishop John M. McNamara, Auxiliary of Baltimore and of Washington, will reside and officiate at Solemn Benediction at the opening service offered for the intention of the "Return of the Other Sheep to the One Fold." The sermon will be given by the Very Rev. Samuel Cummings, S.A., Factor of the Atone-ment Seminary of the Holy Ghost.

On January 19, Msgr. Edward B. Jordan, vice rector of the Catholic University, will preside and officiate at the Benediction. The speaker will be the Rev. Patrick W. Skehan, assistant professor of Semitic Languages at the university. The intention will be for the "Return of Oriental Separatists."

The intention for Sunday, January 20, will be for the "Submission of Anglicans to the Holy See." The Slavonic Rite Liturgy will be celebrated in the morning, and in the evening Bishop Arsene Turquell, O.M.I., retired Vicar Apostolic of Hudson Bay, will preside and officiate at Benediction. The speaker will be the Rev. Robert H. Lord, pastor of St. Paul's Church, Wellesley, Mass.

Msgr. Patrick J. McCormick, rector of Catholic University, will preside on January 21 at the service for the intention of the return of Lutherans and other Protestants of Continental Europe to the Fold. The sermon will be given by the Very Rev. Daniel W. Egan, T.O.R., vice president of St. Francis College, Loretto, Pa.

On January 22 the intention will be "That the Christians in America May Become One in Communion with the Chair of Peter."
