Holy Name Men To Gather at Four Churches

Two Army and two Navy veteran chaplains will be the speakers at four Holy Name Society rallies, Sunday, Jan. 20, in four district churches at 8:30 p. m. services sponsored by the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union in the Rochester diocese.

A veteran Army chaplain will speak at the rally in St. Ann's Church, Howell for all Catholic laymen of that city.

Services in Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the termination of the war will take place in these district churches: District No. 1, Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, speaker, the Rev. Thomas Masley; District No. 2, Holy Rosary Church, speaker, the Rev. Francis J. Peggan; District No. 3, Corpus Christi Church, Rev. Elmer W. Heindl (also active as chaplain); District No. 4, St. Peter and Paul's, the Rev. Edward C. Hannan.

Suggested services include organ music 8:15 to 8:30; National Anthem; Opening Hymn, "Sweet Name Which Makes the Dying Live" (all men to stand and join in singing); Litany of the Holy Name of Jesus; Sermon, solemn benediction of the blessed sacrament; Divine Prayers; Hymn "Holy God We Praise Thy Name."

The four priests invited to address the rallies are all World War veterans.
