President Walter Berj called the breakfast to order and after a few remarks turned the assembly over to Charles Krupp who acted as toastmaster. Responding to toasts of welcome from Father Edick and Holy Name officers, Chaplain Heindl expressed his gratitude for the reception and credited Divine Providence for having spared his life many times during 31 months of combat in the South Pacific. He described close calls with death in New Guinea, the Russell and Northern Luzon where he served with the 57th Infantry Division. Most impressive was his account of how he was trapped on...

### 2 Casualty Names Missing in Magazine

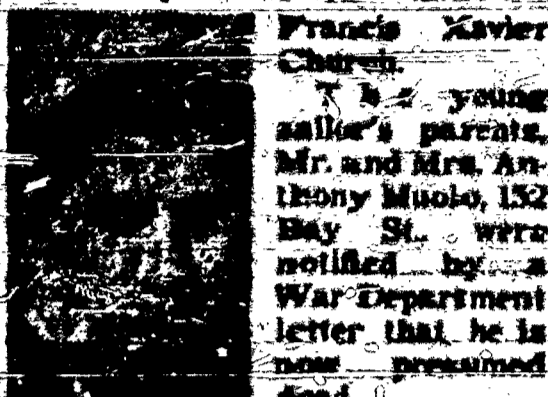

An inadvertent error left these names out of the diocesan compilation listed under the heading "Greater Love Than This Hath No Man..."

a Luzon mountain pass when two Japanese tanks made a surprise suicide-attack. Of those caught in the enemy ambush he was the only one who escaped death or serious wounds, the chaplain revealed. Referring to Chaplain Heindl's distinguished record, Father Flynn also spoke, congratulating St. Andrew's parishioners on the fact that their parish is one of the very few in the nation to have a chaplain who has won the Distinguished Service Cross. "It is the highest award for bravery that a chaplain can receive," he explained, "and it has been awarded in this war to only 19 chaplains of the United States Army."

### Memorial Masses Offered For Soldier and Sailor

Services were held this week for a Navy man officially presumed dead and another name was added to the already overwhelming total of diocesan war dead. Both are parishioners of St. Francis Xavier Church.

Memorial Mass was offered for Thomas I/c Charles J. Muske, 19, Friday, Jan. 11, 1945, in St. Francis Xavier Church.



The young sailor's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Musko, 152 Bay St., were notified by a War Department letter that he is now presumed dead. Previously reported missing in the Pacific theater, he was aboard the submarine Tullibee, which was reported lost in the open sea north-east of Palau Island in March, 1944.

Listed missing Apr. 6 in Germany, Sgt. Stephen F. Gatto, 25, son of Joseph Gatto, 43 Wendell St., was killed on that date; his father has been notified.

Sergeant Gatto who entered service in May, 1941, had served overseas as gunner on a B-17 since last March and is believed to have been on his first mission when killed. He also leaves a sister, Mrs. Frank Favone, at home. Memorial Mass was to be held Thursday, Jan. 17, 1945, in St. Francis Xavier Church.
