(N.C.) — The U.C.B.A. of the Lyons Central School has accepted the resignation of Mrs. John Maboney, its president for 25 years, and Mrs. Bertha McKeon, its vice president for 25 years, to be in effect until the next meeting.

**Edward J. Graney, Trustee Of Lyons Church, Succumbs**

The Edward J. Graney Endowment Fund has been founded here by the Lyons Rotary Club in memory of one of the charter members of the organization and also one of its past presidents who died unexpectedly in his Spencer Street home shortly after 7 o'clock Sunday evening Jan. 6.

Proceeds of the fund shall constitute a commencement prize to be awarded annually to the Lyons Central School senior who is graduating with the highest grade in the school.

Mr. Graney, 53, was a member and lay trustee of St. Michael's Church.

A solemn Requiem Mass was sung in the church Wednesday morning, Jan. 9, by the Rev. John W. Keefe, pastor.

Gerard Gelfin of St. Michael's Church, Newark, chaplain of Newark Council K. of C. of which Mr. Graney was also a member, was deacon. Rev. Leo Jones of St. Joseph's Church, Weedsport, was subdeacon and also conducted final services in St. Joseph's Cemetery, Weedsport.

Also in the sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph E. Grady of St. Bernard's Seminary; Rev. Donald Beninger, C.S.B., of Aquinas Institute, Rochester; Rev. Joseph V. Conlin and Rev. James Callan of St. John's Church, Clyde, and the Rev. J. J. Geaney of St. Felix Church, Clifton Springs.

A resident of Lyons for 11 years where he was supervisor of tracks for the New York Central Railroad between Newark and Syracuse, Mr. Graney had

taken an active and prominent interest in many affairs. He was a member of the Lyons Central School Board of Education on which he had also served as president; the Clarence Clark Post 568, American Legion, at Weedsport which conducted military rites at the grave, and several railroad organizations in addition to groups named.

Bearers were six supervisors of track who at one time or another worked with Mr. Graney: George Wooding and George Bennett, Lyons; J. E. Smith, Rochester; H. V. Smith, North Tonawanda; Thomas J. O'Sullivan, Canastota; and William DeVries, Gouverneur.

Surviving besides his widow, Lucy H. Graney, are four sisters: Mrs. Frances Guyder, Weedsport; Mrs. W. Emmett O'Brien and Mrs. William Naughton, Syracuse; and Mrs. James Cloonan of Rochester; and two brothers, John Graney of Weedsport, where the deceased was born, and Charles Graney of Washington, D. C.
