Army Releases 3 Corning Men

Corning - According to a recent dispatch from the 2nd Infantry Division in Japan, Pfc. Richard Aker, son of Alvin J. Aker, of 68 Danbar St., Corning, is now on his way home under the Army Redeployment Plan. Entering the Army in January, 1943, Pfc. Aker received his basic training at Camp Hood, Tex., and left for overseas duty in May, 1943. Upon his arrival there he was assigned to the "Red Arrow" Division (2nd Infantry) and fought with it at

Soldier, Altage, Morotal, Leyte and Luzon. He was attached to a line company of the Division's 116th Engineer Battalion.

Technical Sgt. Joseph P. Magliocco, son of Mr. and Mrs. Dominick Magliocco, 148 Lexington St., who was honorably discharged from the Army in December, was awarded a Bronze Star medal while serving with the 23rd Division. The sergeant was cited for meritorious service during the Northern Luzon campaign.

Entering the service in 1942, Sgt. Magliocco went overseas in July, 1943, and took part in the New Guinea, Morotal and Philippine Liberation campaigns. He is the holder of the Asiatic-Pacific ribbon with two battle stars and the Philippine Liberation ribbon with one star.

Joseph C. Crispino, son of Mr. and Mrs. Peter Crispino of 128 W. High St., Painted Post, has been notified that at the conclusion of his terminal leave he was advanced to the rank of captain in the Army Air Force and placed in the reserve ranks.

The young man served in the European Theater of Operations over two years as a fighter pilot until he was wounded. Later he piloted a C-47 transport plane.
