**KEENEY**  
"MY REPUTATION" (Adults) Warners. On the trusty theme that one who fleeces another's good name does worse than rob his purse, Catherine Turney has fashioned from Clare Jaynes' novel "Instruct My Sorrows," a starring piece for Barbara Stanwyck and George Brent. Miss Stanwyck's delineation of a well-bred young widow, who supposedly "married to a lovely memory" suddenly engages in a dubious romance with a plump, philandering and middle-aged Major Scott Landis (Brent), is marred by frequent lapses into ill-forgotten spells of adolescent coquetry. The Major has "never believed marriage to be for me," but she accepts romance on his terms. Result: her two boys hear her name scandalized and are shocked. When they go to her, instead of telling them lovingly that people have wronged her, she treats them coldly and behaves like a selfish Hollywood movie queen freshly engaged in justifying her latest amour.

COLONIAL

"DOLL FACE" (Obj. in Part) 20th Century-Fox. Another backstage musical comedy-drama of familiar pattern, this stars Vivian Blane as a burlesque personality with yearnings for a Broadway career. Mike Hannegan (Dennis O'Keefe), operator of the burlesque, is in love with her. To promote her Broadway ambitions he hires an author (Michael Dennis) to ghost a book in her name. (The story is adapted from a play by Guyton Reed Lee who evidently believes that an actress can get a reputation for "culture" by posing as an authoress.) Author and burlesque "queen" get emotionally involved and the boss doesn't like it. Eventually — as we know all the time — we go back to where we started. Naive and unimpaired, this is devised for the tin-pan alley fans.

Suggestive dances invite the conclusion that burlesque still is burlesque even when they put it on Broadway. Director Lew Seiler should be required to cut one line of dialogue in which a star character says, "Burlesque is education" . . . every Saturday night the show's full of college boys!" People of low tastes often are quite literal minded, and this film obviously is meant for them.

STRAND

"HOLD THAT BLONDE!" (Adults) Paramount. From a Paul Armstrong play three writers devise a madcap comedy starring Eddie Bracken as a dithering kleptomaniac whose malady precipitates a chain of misunderstandings and mirthful mix-ups. Almost every slapstick routine from Mack Sennett to Preston Sturges is dragged in, including the Harold Lloyd teeter-totter on a skyscraper window sill. Veronica Lake co-stars with Albert Dekker and Negro comedian Willie Best in chie, supporting roles sheer nonsense from beginning to end. It is directed by George Marshall for laughs and giggles only.
