

## National L.C.B.A. Head, Known in Diocese, Resigns

**Troy, N. Y.** — (NC) — The board of supreme trustees of the Ladies Catholic Benevolent Association has accepted the resignation of Miss Kate Mahoney, supreme president for 25 years, and has appointed Miss Bertha McNamee, of Erie, Pa., supreme recorder, to fill the office until the national convention in July, it was announced here. Miss Margaret M. Carroll, of Cleveland, supreme trustee for a number of years, was appointed to succeed Miss McNamee.

Miss Kate Mahoney is widely known in the Rochester chapter. She has been closely associated with Mrs. Anna L. Ryan of Rochester, supreme trustee and the late Mrs. Cora McFarlin who was also a supreme trustee, and has been here for L. C. B. A. events.

"Miss Mahoney has been a whiz at business," Mrs. Ryan stated this week pointing out that when the Troy Catholic laywoman leader took over administration of the L.C.B.A. the assets were \$1,000,000 and as she relinquished her duties, they have grown to nearly \$20,000,000.

The L.C.B.A. convened in Rochester in July 1923 and Miss Mahoney presided and was reelected supreme president. She was alive in Rochester on the occasion of the Golden Jubilee of the branches in the Diocese of Rochester and attended Solemn Pontifical Mass celebrated by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney in Blessed Heart Cathedral; Oct. 28, 1934, commemorating the Jubilee.

President of the L.C.B.A. down through the years has been greatly enhanced by Miss Mahoney's leadership. Mrs. Ryan told the COURIER-JOURNAL this week: A dinner honoring the retiring national leader was held Thursday at Henry Hudson Hotel in Troy.

The ship which the Japanese claimed to have sunk on successive reports was to the thick of the fighting from the early days of Pearl Harbor. It was once Admiral Halsey's flagship. It saw action at the Marshall Islands, at Wake and Marcus, and culminated its achievements at Okinawa. Its pilots were justly proud of their record: 811 Japanese planes shot down; 71 Japanese vessels sunk.

That the great ship came through all this successfully and victoriously is attributed to the Blessed Mother's protection by the Catholic personnel aboard who gathered each evening to recite the Rosary to the Star of the Sea.

## Eire's President Pledges Aid to 'Hungry Neighbors'



## Inside on China Communist War Told by Maryknoller

**CHUNGKING LISTENING POST** by Rev. Mark Tennien, M.M., as reviewed by John Gaitley.

"On Posts of the Cross" is the title of the first section of Father Tennien's engrossing two-hundred pages of an easy-to-read autobiography of a Catholic priest in China during the war years. He was a Maryknoll missioner but he writes easily of his own experiences and those of other black-clad Americans from New York, Vermont, Iowa, Pennsylvania, and Massachusetts defending the Japanese invaders in the interests of the Chinese people and downed American fliers alike.

"There were those who called Chiang's government dictatorial and reactionary, but observers of long residence, familiar with the intricacies of Chinese resurgence, could see no substitute for the authoritarian Chungking regime."
