LOEW'S ROCHESTER
"SPELLBOUND" (Adults)
 (Unite) Artists. A Ben Hecht-Alfred Hitchcock adaptation of Francis Beeding's novel "The House of Dr. Edwardes," with emphasis upon Freudian theories. Starring Ingrid Bergman and Gregory Peck, story deals with psychiatric treatment of amnesia and guilt complexes. Hitchcock attempts his usual suspense and shock tactics with occasional success. Story moves slowly until half-way through after which it develops into a "cops and robbers" chase, with Dr. Ingrid Bergman trying to conduct Dr. Gregory Peck (minus his memory) over the trail of a murderer he suspects he committed. She finally clears him, his mind clears itself, the way is clear for them to marry and it is clear to the audience that the story, despite both Hecht and Hitchcock, is pure hokum.

There is a suggestion of sub-

side at the end, and the social and professional proprieties are disregarded by the leading male and female doctors. Not by any means Hitchcock's best film.
