Five of Seven Sons Leave Service for Corning Home

Corning—Mrs. Susie Sweet of 123 Front St., is both proud and grateful these days because five of her seven sons in the armed forces are now at home with her. Two of the boys are still in foreign service.

The boys who have been discharged are: Sgt. Raymond Sweet who enlisted in March 1943; saw service in France, Germany and Austria and was discharged in September, 1945. Chief Electrician's Mate Leo A. Sweet, enlisted in April, 1942; served in the Gilberts, Marshalls, Marianas and Alutians; discharged Nov. 7, 1945.

Yeoman 1/c Joseph A. Sweet, enlisted April, 1942; was on duty

with his brother, Les, in the Gilberts, Marshalls, Marianas and Alutians, discharged Nov. 19, 1945.

Sgt. Adrian L. Sweet, enlisted June, 1941; served in Panama, France and the Philippines; discharged Dec. 4, 1945.

Sgt. Gerald P. Sweet, enlisted November, 1942; served in New Guinea and the Philippines; discharged Jan. 2, 1946.

The two young men who are still in service are Pvt. Edward Sweet, who is in Japan and Gunnery Mate 1/c Edward V. Sweet, now in Italy as a member of the USS Craven.

Two more Corning boys to be recently honorably discharged from the Army recently are Staff Sgt. Edward L. Hart and Technician 5th Grade Robert Krebs.

Sgt. Hart, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward L. Hart, 223 Denison Pkwy., received his discharge Jan. 11, after three years of service. He has been on duty in the Pacific area with the 122nd Cavalry which played an important part in the liberation of the Philippine Islands.

A graduate of St. Patrick's School and Corning Free Academy, Sgt. Hart now holds the American Service Medal, Asiatic Pacific Service Medal with three battle stars for New Guinea, Leyte and Luzon, Good Conduct medal and Victory medal.

T/S Krebs, the son of Leo Krebs, 117 W. Fifth St., entered the service in October, 1942. He saw service overseas for nearly three years, having spent 26 months in New Guinea. For the past few months he has been stationed at Clark Field in the Philippines.

He is a graduate of St. Mary's Parochial School and Corning Free Academy.

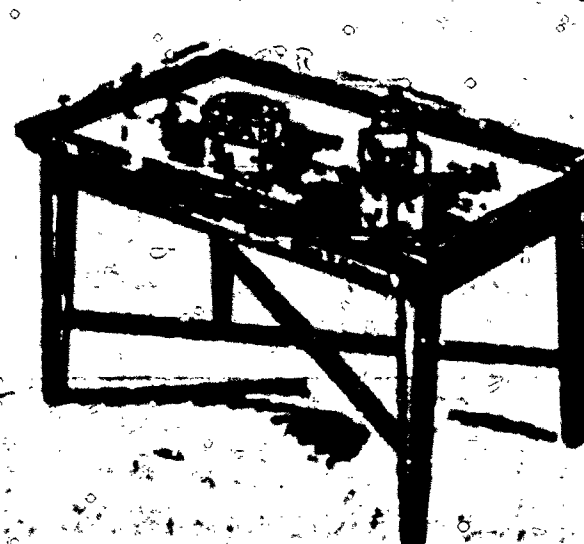
