

## Argentina Official Picks New Cardinals

**ROCKAWAY** — (NC) — The selection by His Holiness Pope Pius XII of Bishop Antonio Gag-

lano of Rosario, to be a member of the Sacred College of Cardinals, was characterized by Dr. Juan Cooke, Argentine Minister of Foreign Affairs, as a distinct honor for Argentina as well as a deserving honor for the prelate.

The tribute was paid at a luncheon which Dr. Cooke gave in honor of Cardinal designate Caggiano. ## Sen. Wagner Joins Catholic Church

Ferdinand Wagner, 69, D. N. S., embraced the Catholic faith. The senator is recovering from influenza.

Sen. Wagner, who has been called one of the great friends of humanity because of his sponsorship of social security and labor legislation, was baptized last Thursday by Msgr. Robert F. Megan.

Born a Lutheran in Germany and becoming a Methodist in this country, the senator turned to the Catholic faith after many years of contemplating the move. He was quoted today as saying: "Al Smith and I talked about it and before Al died I told him I would become a Catholic."

The Catholic faith is not new to Sen. Wagner. His wife, who died in 1919, was a Catholic, and his son, Robert F. Wagner, Jr., was reared a Catholic.

Sen. Wagner for many years has been a close friend of Cardinal-designate Francis J. Spellman, Archbishop of New York, and of many other prominent Catholic dignitaries.

Sen. Wagner received his final instructions in the Catholic faith while a patient at the hospital. Present at the baptismal ceremony were Sen. Wagner's son and his second wife, Susan; Francis J. Quilligan, son-in-law of Al Smith, and Marguerite Cumming, Senator Wagner's secretary.

With Senator Wagner's conversion both New York Senators are Catholics. The other is Senator Mead of Buffalo. This is believed to be the first time in American history that a single state is represented in the Senate by two Catholics.

"We want a perpetual peace that recognizes man as a free creature of God and not a vassal of an all-powerful state. We want a guarantee to all of mankind of freedom of expression and not to limit him to a mere parroting of a despotic government."

"If Russia really wishes peace and the respect of all the world, she must cease attacks upon a most ancient, respected and venerable institution."

If the Soviet Union is to survive, he warned, it must borrow from the learnings and teachings of religion.

(According to dispatches from Rome, *Osservatore Romano*, also taking sharp issue with the Soviet assertions, said that Izvestia, "as usual, confused religious moves with political ones." Referring particularly to the Moscow charges of anti-sovietism, brought against Cardinals-designate Francis J. Spellman of New York and Bernard Griffin of London, the Vatican daily reminded that Archbishop Spellman was well known for defending the Vatican against critics on the other side, who demanded the Holy See should launch an anti-Soviet campaign.

Archbishop Griffin, too, *Osservatore* is quoted as saying, is well known for his anti-Nazi utterances. The new German Cardinals-designate, charged by Izvestia with being "lenient" to the Nazis, have, "on the contrary, distinguished themselves by offering shelter to those men who for many years battled for a country of liberty and democracy," *Osservatore* said in report.

## Abp. Spellman 'Not Surprised'

That's His Comment on  
'Izvestia' Attack

New York — (NC) — Cardinal-designate Francis J. Spellman, Archbishop of New York, is accustomed to attacks by enemies of religion, of America and of world peace, and is not surprised at renewed attacks by the "puppets of pretenders to peace," the Chancery of the Archdiocese of New York said.

The statement followed the appearance in secular papers and reports from Moscow that Izvestia, official Soviet newspaper, had launched an attack upon the 32 new Cardinals-designate and upon Archbishop Spellman and Archbishop Bernard Griffin of Westminster, England, in particular. It said the paper accused Archbishop Spellman of overzealousness toward the Franco regime in Spain.

In response to queries for comment regarding the article in Izvestia attacking Archbishop Spellman, the statement issued here said, "The Chancery Office answers that the Archbishop has been accustomed to attacks by enemies of religion, of America, and of world peace. He has been assailed by the minions of Hitler, Mussolini and other tyrants and is not surprised at renewed baseless attacks by puppets of pretenders to peace."

## Schools, Hospitals Can Buy Surplus for 40 Percent Off

Washington — (NC) — Catholic schools and hospitals may buy surplus war property at a special 40% discount under provisions of a liberalized "interim procedure" policy of the War Assets Corporation in force until February 16. The institutions may certify their non-profit status to the nearest RFC office and place their orders simultaneously.

After the expiration of the "interim procedure," which was disclosed by the War Assets Corporation here, all orders from schools must be channeled through the state agency for surplus property and be approved by a U. S. Office of Education official, and orders from hospitals must have the approval of the Public Health Service.

Lists of available items suitable for institutional use are to be mailed by the N.A.C. to institutions interested in the purchase of surplus property. A "priority expert" has been named at each of the 31 regional offices to handle the needs of nonprofit institutions. It was revealed.

Catholic institutions other than schools and hospitals are not eligible for the 40% price discount, but may buy into the surplus stockpile at the lowest trade level price.
